A special thank you to everyone who participated in the Pampered Chef fundraiser to support Blessings in a Backpack. The money we received from Pampered Chef will supply meals for several children during the school year. Thank you again and enjoy your products. As you use them remember the children.

A New Year is starting numerically, but the 2023-2024 school year continues. Webster Congregational Christian Church continues to pack backpacks of nonperishable food to deliver to students at Havre de Grace Elementary School each week for 75 students.

Webster Church has a special account at Sysco through the National Headquarters of Blessings in a Backpack which is used to purchase three rotating menu packs for the backpacks. The Hope Center and the Scouts had food drives which supply many extra items for the long weekends and winter and spring breaks. Doris and Gary Lyttle order the food and deliver the backpacks to the school. A special thank you to those who help pack the backpacks for each weekend.

The children are very grateful for these items as for some, this may be the only food they have for the weekend. \$150 will supply food for a year per child.
