#### **An Advent Message from Pastor Jim**

At this morning's Bible Study, we learned that the first four spoken words in the Gospel of Luke are "Do not be afraid!" They are spoken to Zechariah by the Angel Gabriel because when Zechariah first saw him in the Temple of Jerusalem, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him. The complete sentence is, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, for your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you will name him John." And that son will turn out to be none other than John the Baptist. Then in the very next story that same Angel Gabriel will visit a young virgin whose name is Mary. The Angel will say to her "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus."

Although it's pretty cheeky of an Angel to tell two prospective parents what they are to name their first-born children, it's even more cheeky when one is an old man and getting along in years, and the other is a virgin betrothed to a carpenter. But the real message is *not to be afraid*. And this is the underlying message throughout the Gospel of Luke. And both babies will grow up and will be living examples of that message. Do not be afraid!

I know that most of us are still grieving over the passing of our dear friend and brother and pillar of Webster Church, Art Helton. And that's an honest and understandable place to be. And some of you might be asking yourselves, "What's going to happen to us? What's going to happen to Webster Church?" And that too is an honest and understandable place to be. But if I know Art Helton, he'd say, "Do not be afraid, Webster Church, for you have found favor with God. Do not be afraid Webster Church, for your prayers have been answered." In a way, Art Helton was our very own Angel Gabriel. He always showed up with great conviction, authority, determination, and integrity. And he always knew exactly what we should do. So, let's celebrate Art Helton this Advent season by not being afraid and remembering another quote the Angel Gabriel told the virgin Mary, "With God, nothing shall be called impossible." We love you, Art Helton! And we mean it!

#### **MODERATOR**

I am happy to report we have contracted with a local company to replace the large double doors to the Webster Church Sanctuary. The replacement will also require additional carpentry, new hardware, and closers. The new doors will be wooden as are the originals. The side door to the lower level will also be replaced as it has suffered rain damage over the years.

The total cost of the project is \$18,000. Some portion of the cost is in our current operating budget, but we are short approximately \$8,000.

We are seeking donations to complete the project in time for our 100th Anniversary and to present a new and welcoming front to our church.

On a personal note, the door project has been honchoed by my husband Art over the past year and he spent many hours trying to find a bidder for the best price. The contractor was selected just before he became ill. His colleague Vince Culotta will manage the project on Art's behalf. We are both happy to see this work proceed now.
