Tell me how you would check the engine oil level:

Open the car bonnet and locate the engine oil dipstick.

Pull out the dipstick and wipe it clean with a cloth or tissue.

Pull out the dipstick again and check that the oil level is between the minimum and maximum markers. If it's below the minimum, add more oil as required.

Show me how you would check the brake fluid level:

Tell me how you would check the tyre pressure:

Show me how you would check the headlights and taillights:
