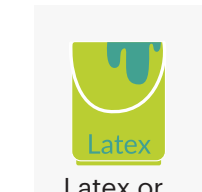
Electronics, TVs, and computers



Empty containers



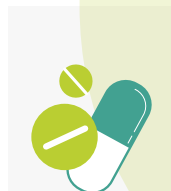
Explosives

Latex or water-based paint



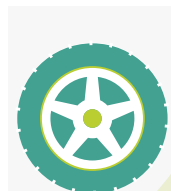
Medical sharps
