BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

**Board Meeting Minutes
October 2, 2023**

**Call to Order 7:20 PM
ROLL CALL**

MINUTES

Dick moved to approve the September combined Board of Director and General Membership meeting minutes. EJ seconded the motion. The motion passed by a majority vote of the Board.

REPORTS

TREASURER

Dick mentioned that he is working to be able to segregate the monies from the monthly dues and dockage into the separate, capital improvement fund rather than having the monies comingled in the reports. He stated that approximately \$28,000 to \$29,000 monthly is going towards that fund and there is approximately \$139,405 in that fund at the present time. He will present the report at the General meeting.

SECRETARY

Barbara advised that the October newsletters had been completed and provided copies to the Board and members present at the meeting. I will be mailing out the newsletters by the end of the week.

Tony read a statement regarding the behavior of the Board members and membership.

NEW BUSINESS

SECRETARY

Barbara spoke of the possibility of the Club sponsoring a booth at the Pompano Beach Nautical Flea Market in January, 2024, to promote membership in the Club. She will raise the issue again at the next meeting as the deadline for early application is December 1, 2023.

DOCKS & GROUNDS

EJ spoke about a letter received from Capt. Douglas Meier. Capt. Meier was present and spoke regarding a proposal to have outside boats use the Club's marina on a temporary basis. EJ stated that he would meet with Sheldon Crabtree, the By-Laws Committee chair to see if the proposal will fit within the parameters of the by-laws.

Joey reported that there are two new members to be presented at the General meeting.

SOCIAL

Tony reported on the upcoming ACME/75th Anniversary party scheduled for Saturday, 10/14. He also stated that he would be cooking pork tenderloins for Friday night, 10/6. GOOD OF THE ORDER

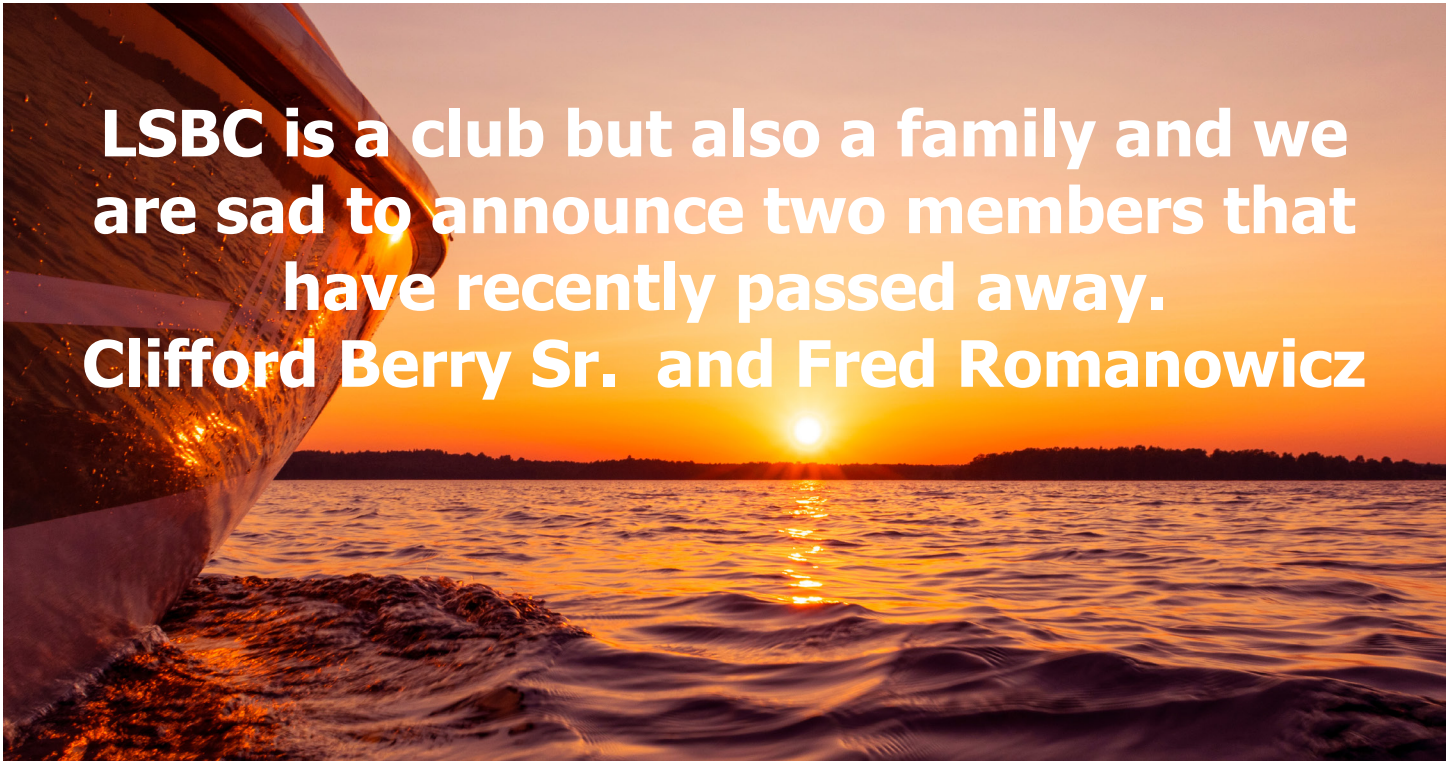
- Bob Anz spoke of the upcoming party.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:07 PM.

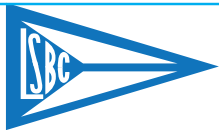
MOMENT OF SILENCE
