A discussion took place on the 2023 Airport project. The project will consist of an Automated Weather Observing System (AWOS) to be installed. A motion was made by Mohr, seconded by Cimpl to approve the engineering and planning proposals for the Wagner Airport AWOS system. All voted aye, motion carried.

A discussion took place on updating the City of Wagner's comprehensive plan. A motion was made by Soukup, seconded by Cimpl to approve District III to update the comprehensive plan. All voted aye, motion carried.
