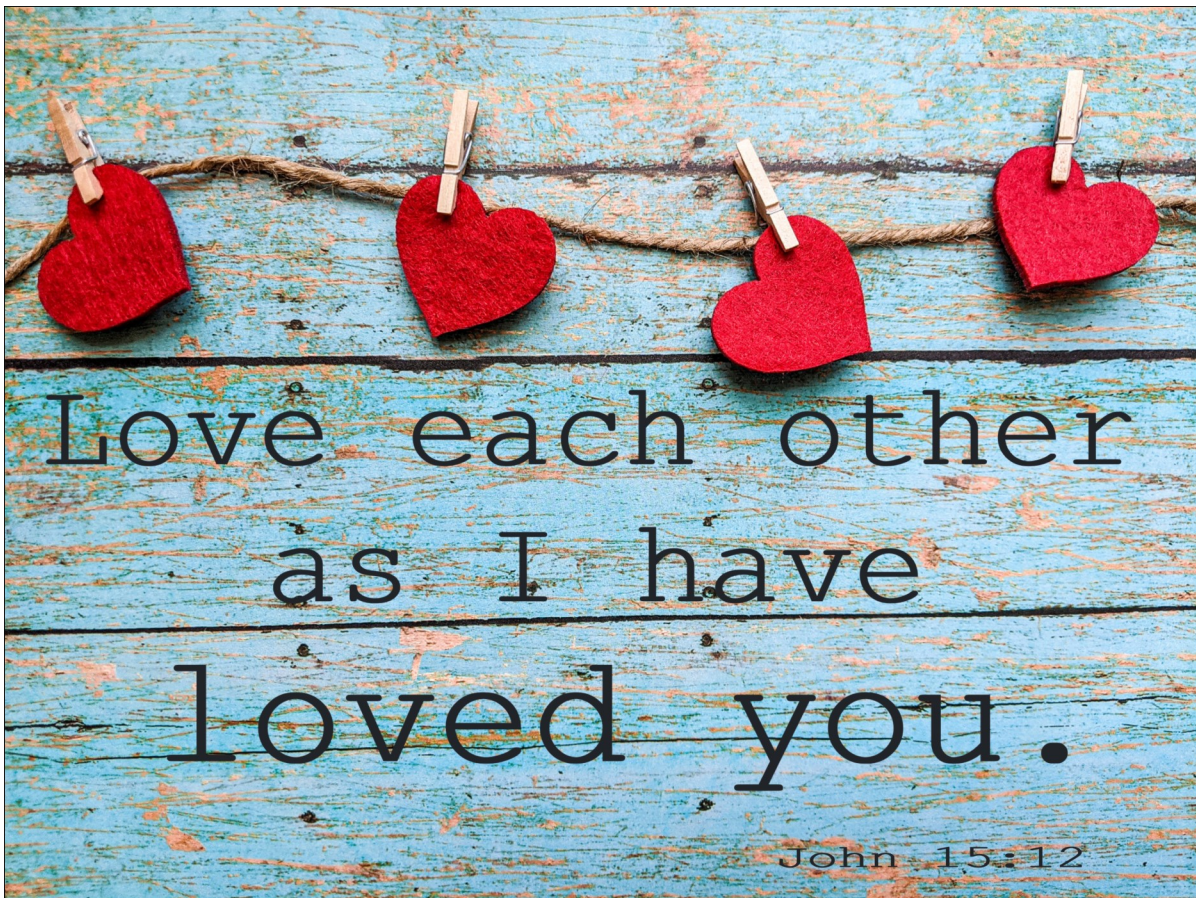

A SACRAMENTAL TSUNAMI

This weekend begins what I am sure will be a hectic, exhausting, but life-giving week here at Holy Cross. On Saturday we had our first two First Holy Communion celebrations. Next Saturday we have our final two. On Monday, Bishop Romero, who is one of the auxiliary bishops of our diocese, will be visiting to celebrate Confirmation for 130 of our young people. In addition to all these special celebrations, we also have our usual array of daily and weekend Masses and Confessions. On Saturday is our monthly Holy Hour. Sunday is the regularly scheduled Anointing of the Sick and Baptisms. The past few weeks have been unusually slow for funerals, so we will probably get a few of those as well. The pews will not even have a chance to cool off this week from all the use they will get.

It is impossible to get through a week like this without the support and commitment of our Pastoral Team, Staff, and countless dedicated parish ministers. For some, the journey has been years as catechists teaching the same group of children from First Communion all the way through to Confirmation. For others, it was a few hours of outdoor work to beautify the courtyard for these special occasions. Whatever the contribution, I thank all those who lend a helping hand for these important moments in the lives of our parishioners.

Some good news is that I got the squirrel out of my attic. I thought for certain there were several who moved in, but it was determined to be just one. The pest control company was able to capture him and move him to a different location. The entrance into the attic now has a temporary patch on it. Is there anyone out there good at replacing siding as well as some pieces of vinyl soffit? I would love to have a chitchat with you. The bad news is that as quickly as the squirrel went away, I am now dealing with at least one mouse in the house. I have my have-a-heart trap set. So far, I caught one who I moved to greener pastures. I'm not sure if there are more. Who knows who will move in next week?

We have not been able to livestream since April 22. We are not sure what the difficulty is, but it appears that the Facebook format is no longer cooperating. We understand there are some at home who appreciate this connection to the parish as they are unable to otherwise attend. We are considering other options such as creating our own YouTube channel. While we are trying our best to resolve the situation, it will not likely be addressed for another few weeks until we can schedule a time when those who know about these things are able to get together. I'm sorry for the inconvenience.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will take place after the 9:30 Mass.

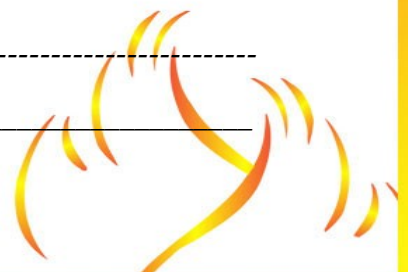

LITURGY BYTES

Importance of the Eucharist

With the beginning of First Holy Communion celebrations here at Holy Cross, I thought a few reflective thoughts about the greatest gift we have been given would be in order.



The bishops of the United States created a three-year plan to revive and foster Eucharistic devotion in the hearts of us, the faithful. Believing in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is what makes Catholics different from other Christians. At Mass, the bread and wine are truly transformed into Christ's Body and Blood. We call this the Real Presence. There is absolutely no doubt that Jesus is present under the forms of bread and wine. The bread and wine ARE NOT symbols. Each week we have the opportunity to receive Jesus at Mass. The Mass is the summit and source of the Christian life. Yet, you and I both know many have fallen away from joining us at Mass on weekends. Why?

Because of COVID, some drifted away and were satisfied watching the livestream at home. For a short period, this was welcomed, and many felt it was better than nothing. However, just sitting and watching seems empty without the experience of coming forth to receive Jesus in your hands. Even those who are homebound have the opportunity to receive Our Lord at least once a week, thanks to those Eucharistic Ministers who serve our parish's homebound. I am certain there are many others, not homebound, who continue to remain at home instead of attending Mass in person. If you know someone who is homebound because of illness or age and would like to receive Our Lord, please contact the Outreach office. We have many Eucharistic Ministers who would be happy to bring that person Communion each week. Also, for those who might wish to serve as a Eucharistic Minister for the weekend Masses, we always need your assistance. Think about it and be sure to speak to Fr. Michael.
