

FROM FONT TO FONT

On July 9, 1961 my Uncle Tony stood next to his beloved wife Bea, who was my godmother. They witnessed the pouring of the water of my baptism at the font in Notre Dame Church in New Hyde Park. On October 3, 2023 I took water from the baptismal font at St. Theresa's Church in Spring Hill, Florida, to bless his body as his funeral Mass began. His journey on this earth came to an end after ninety-eight beautiful years. Perhaps these may be seen as two random moments in the life of the Church. But with God's Spirit, very little is left to chance. These moments have the capacity to create deep human relationships and open ourselves to the wonder of God.

The sacraments of the Church are rich in meaning, but there is also a profound simplicity to them. A touch of oil, a piece of bread, and a few drops of water may not seem to be all that significant. But, indeed, deep connections can be made with one another. And more importantly, they become moments of contact with God. We can plan for a sacrament and schedule it for a specific time. We can't underestimate the blessings that can take place when we avail ourselves to the sacraments of the Church. Perhaps too often today, they are not valued or embraced by all. But once we place ourselves in the midst of that prayer, it is all left to the workings of the Spirit which are beyond our control. We may see it as a defining experience in our lives at that moment. Or it may take the passing of time for us to realize all the ways in which God's wonder was at work.

I'm sure on the day of my baptism my uncle had no idea this two-week-old baby would one day be officiating at his funeral Mass. Some things we can anticipate. As I approached my ordination, I knew in the back of my mind that one day I would need to officiate at my mother's funeral. This opportunity to minister to my uncle and his family was an unexpected moment that came along. I came to the realization a little over a month ago that it may happen. I was able to visit him in his home in Florida along with my sister and brother-in-law. I was privileged to anoint him. It was a moment of mutual giving and receiving. I shared with him a sacrament of the Church. He shared with us the witness of life that was lived with love and gratitude for all he had.

Would there still be sadness at my uncle's passing if we had not had these holy encounters? Yes. Would there be a profound sense of God's presence woven throughout and beautifully revealed had we not shared these sacramental moments? I'm not so sure. There were sixty-two years between those two experiences around the font, a lot of time transpired. Although perhaps not always noticed, there was an unmistakable flow in the river of God's life that once again has bubbled to the surface to remind us how blessed we are. Rest in peace, Uncle Tony.

ADOPT A GRANDPARENT MINISTRY




Do you know a senior who is homebound or a senior who would like some interaction with young people?

LITURGY BYTES

The Angels

On October 2nd, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Guardian Angels. This feast is most comforting as it was one of the first prayers I was taught in first grade. Perhaps a few might recall these words: "Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love, commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guide to rule and guard. Amen." Guardian angels are not just for children. Actually, their role is to represent individuals before God, to watch over them always, to aid their prayer and be with them at death.

Devotion to the angels began to develop with the monastic tradition, specifically with St. Benedict and St. Bernard of Clairvaux. The latter is known as an eloquent spokesman for the guardian angels and angelic devotion. Their feast was first observed in the 16th century and added to the Roman calendar by Pope Paul V. Always keep in mind that the angels are an expression of faith of God's enduring love and providential care that is extended to each of us day by day.

A few days before the Feast of the Guardian Angels is the Feast of the Archangels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael on September 29th. Devotion to Michael is the oldest angelic devotion beginning in the East in the fourth century and then in the West in the fifth century. Michael is depicted as the defender, the warrior in the book of Daniel as well as in the book of Revelation where he is seen leading God's armies to the final victory over the forces of evil. Also, in the book of Daniel, Gabriel is pictured announcing Michael's role in God's plan. He is best known for his appearance to Mary as she consents to bear the Christ Child. Raphael's activity is mostly in the Old Testament in the story of Tobit. He guides Tobit's son, Tobiah, through a series of fantastic adventures leading to many happy endings: marriage to Sarah, healing of Tobit's blindness, and restoring the family's fortune.

Each of these archangels performs a different mission showing us God's protection, communication, and guidance. We cannot dismiss angels too lightly.



Our ability to do that is only possible through the giving spirit of the parishioners of Holy Cross.

We thank you so very much for your consistent support of Parish Outreach and its programs.

As we draw near to the holiday season (the busiest time for Parish Outreach), we invite you to consider these suggestions on ways to join us in "Being Christ" for our neighbors who continue to struggle in their life journey.



1. Monetary "basket" donations (cash, check or supermarket gift cards) will be appreciated to help defray the expenses of our Thanksgiving Basket Program. You can mark your envelope "Thanksgiving" and drop it in the collection basket.
