WARMING UP THE OVEN

Life keeps rolling along, sometimes faster than we prefer. Thanksgiving is on Thursday. For many people the shopping and preparation have begun. This year I will once again be driving to my brother's house in Pennsylvania. He lives just a bit west of Allentown. As long as traffic cooperates, and it usually does in the morning, it is a relatively easy drive. Please remember we have a special Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 9:00. It is a beautiful way to begin the day. Normally Thanksgiving weekend is the beginning of Advent, but this year the calendar says it does not begin until the weekend of December 2nd/3rd.

I like fiddling around in the kitchen, but one thing I have never attempted to make is a Thanksgiving turkey. I could probably stumble my way through it. But the greater challenge for me would be the carving. I do not have that gift. It would look like the makings of turkey salad if I tried to do that. My brother will handle the turkey; I'll take care of saying grace.

This week we had a meeting of the Finance Committee. We finally reviewed the last fiscal year that ended on August 31st. When we hit the "total button" we came out with a surplus of a little over \$10,000. While that means we are operating on a thin line, we are in fact operating with a balanced budget. Not every parish is in this position. It comes about through your ongoing generosity and our efforts to be good stewards of what we have received. Unfortunately, some parishes continually face shortfalls in the operating budget which creates an ever-present financial cloud. We are blessed not to live in that shadow of financial uncertainty. However, we will once again return to publishing quarterly statements in the bulletin. This is one detail of life that got derailed with Covid, and we will return to the practice.

There is one significant on-going issue related to finances that has yet to be resolved, the bankruptcy of the Diocese. This has been going on for more than three years now. Aside from occasional references in Newsday, it has not gotten much attention. It seems we are now in the final steps of coming to some kind of resolution. Exactly how the settlement will unfold is not yet known. The one detail that has gotten some attention in the news is the question of parish participation. It seems most probable that all parishes will need to be contributing to the settlement fund. Of course, once the specific details are known I will share that information with you.

It looks like we will have five new altar servers joining the ranks. I am always happy to see the kids come along and want to help out in this way. That's how I began my Church career!

Liturgy Bytes—Happy Thanksgiving

Do you realize that Thanksgiving and Eucharist mean the same thing? Even though it has been pointed out many times in the past, it does not hurt to reflect on it once again as we get ready to celebrate Thanksgiving Day on November 23rd.

The word "thanksgiving" is derived from the Greek word "eucharist," which is the same word that refers to both the Mass and the Sacrament of Holy Communion. It is also wonderful to see and know that many Catholics start their Thanksgiving Day by attending Mass in their parishes. Here at Holy Cross, we will have Mass on Thanksgiving morning at 9:00. We encourage everyone who is available to join your parish family to offer thanks before you join your family members.

Returning to the meaning of Eucharist, we should realize that the whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Mass and the Sacraments. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains it this way: "It is called Eucharist because it is an action of thanksgiving to God. The Greek words eucharistein and eulogein recall the Jewish blessings that proclaim, especially during a meal, God's works of creation, redemption and sanctification." This sacrament is called the Eucharist precisely because it is a thanksgiving offered to God for these gifts. The Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life and as such, it is the highest form of thanksgiving that we can offer. As we know, there is a meal aspect to the Eucharist that provides a connection to our secular holiday of Thanksgiving. The Eucharist is much more than a common meal. The Eucharist is a sacrifice of thanksgiving to the Father, a blessing by which the Church expresses her gratitude to God for everything He has given us, the things we know and those we do not know. Are we not so blessed to have the opportunity to receive Our Lord on many more occasions than just once a year each time we attend Mass? Make an effort to start your Thanksgiving Day celebration this year with Mass.

This can be done on the top right of the front or back of the card. This would be very helpful in eliminating the time-consuming job of calling for amounts on cards of unknown amounts. I thank you in advance for your help in this matter.

Some Angels are coded (orange, purple, green, red) for the agencies we reach out to each year (Mercy Haven, Talbot House, Pronto, Olsen's Rest Home). If you choose one of these Angels, attach the Angel on top of the item with tape and return to the Atrium by Sunday, December 3rd.

We ask that all gifts NOT be wrapped.
