THE END OF THE YEAR

No, it's not December 31. But the Feast of Christ the King marks the end of the liturgical year. One of the things I look forward to at the end of the calendar year is when news broadcasts and other shows do a "year in review." It is common to see a summation of the notable news events and achievements of the last year. On this day, I'm not going to sing "Auld Lang Syne," but it is appropriate for us to review some of the liturgical highlights of the past year.

The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ calls for a Eucharistic Procession. Aside from Holy Thursday, that was something that was not part of our routine here. But, on that day, at every Mass we had a procession that went through the courtyard and the Children's Garden. I was not sure how successful it would be. Much to my delight, most everyone at every Mass participated in that procession. It took on a life to itself.

On the weekend closest to the Exaltation of the Holy Cross we also had a grand entrance procession at some of our Masses that were led by children of the parish. There was a Call to Worship in the courtyard, followed by a beautiful procession of everyone entering the Worship Area together. Also, on that day, we utilized the large white cloth upon which people had written petitions and the names of loved ones. It was a beautiful way to start the Liturgy and to celebrate our parish community.

We had several liturgies in which specific grade levels in our Religious Education program were invited to attend. It is always good to see a full church and so many families. We also utilized colorful new banners and streamers for Pentecost. Again on those days, our youth participated in a special way. And, in this past year, the tabernacle found a new home in the sanctuary. It is in a prominent location and the lighting highlights it in a beautiful way.

The Church in America is in the midst of a Eucharistic Revival. There is great effort being made to bring people to a deeper appreciation of the gift and power of the Eucharist. Our efforts here at Holy Cross have helped to enhance our celebration of this sacred and precious gift. I am grateful to all those who help to bring our liturgy to life such as our Liturgy Committee and all our Liturgical Ministries. As many as are involved, there is always room for more. Let us know if you would like to be one of those helping hands. There is more to come. We are making great efforts to enhance our Sunday worship during the upcoming season of Lent.

We are a blessed people to be able share in the Eucharist. We are blessed to have a vibrant community in which we can pray together. May we continue to strive to become what we share in, the Body of Christ.



LITURGY BYTES

<u>Christ the King</u>

This weekend the Church celebrates the feast of Christ the King and the end of the Liturgical year. This feast is fairly new to the Church calendar as it was established in the 20th century. The feast is designed to give special recognition to Christ, Our Lord.



Pope Pius XI instituted the feast in 1925 with his encyclical entitled Quas Primas (In the First), to respond to growing secularism and atheism. In that encyclical, the Pope noted that the continuing disorder of that era had long been festering and was the result of nations rejecting Christ. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as king forever.

Later on, in 1969 Pope Paul VI took some steps to enhance the witness of the feast day. He changed the name of the celebration to the feast of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of All." He also changed the date to the last Sunday in the liturgical year, emphasizing even more strongly the connection between Christ's kingship and His second coming. He also raised the feast to the highest rank of celebration on the Church calendar, that of a "solemnity."

For Christians, when our faith is repeatedly marginalized in public life, we can fall into the habit of compartmentalizing our lives. We love Jesus in our private lives, but we shrink from acknowledging the kingship of Christ in social life. When we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King, we declare to the world and to ourselves that Jesus is the Lord of the Church and the entire universe.




