SHIVER ME TIMBERS

Last Sunday evening was more than just a blustery night, the winds were quite strong. I was sitting in my living room falling asleep just after 10:00 when I was awoken to a sickening crash. It sounded like someone dropped a steel shipping container from a great height. I put on my coat and ran out the door. My plan was to go down to the road thinking I would see a tractor trailer that had fallen prey to some calamity. However, at the top of my driveway I was stopped in my tracks. A panel of the stockade fence was missing; I thought it simply had blown down. But much to my dismay, it was pushed over by a large tree that had been at the side of my driveway.

The tree fell towards my neighbor on Rolling Hills Drive, and it was not a gentle landing. Among its list of destructive blows, it punched several holes in the deck, broke a window, and flattened a patio table. Both the bewildered homeowners and I stood in disbelief looking at a once beautiful backyard deck that now looked like a crash sight. The one enormous blessing that everyone quickly realized was that no one was hurt. There is a young man who lives there who regularly gathers there with his friends. Had it been occupied, we would be dealing with a tragedy.

The first task on Monday was to notify the Diocese and our insurance agent. Both were quite helpful, and the process to clean up and repair the damages began. We were able to get the fallen tree removed by Tuesday. It may take some time to return everything to its original state, but again we are so very grateful that it was just stuff that got broken and nobody got hurt. We will need to be addressing others trees along my driveway that are less than healthy and could pose a threat.

This weekend begins the season of Advent. This year is particularly crazy as Christmas falls on a Monday. That means the entirety of the fourth week of Advent is limited to Saturday evening and Sunday morning. Admittedly, Advent seems to be out of sync with the rest of our society that has been advertising and selling for Christmas since weeks before Thanksgiving. As counter-cultural as it seems, there really is wisdom in the invitation to live in expectation and waiting. The clearest example of the beauty of this experience is a family awaiting the birth of a child. Those months are filled with wonder and awe. Pregnancy should not be the only scenario of waiting that is holy. We tend to be an impatient people and want immediate gratification. Through our prayer and discipline we can make these weeks peaceful and hopeful. We all have lots of stuff to do, but let us not overlook the opportunity given us as we prepare once again to rejoice in the birth of our Savior.



We Have a New Year

This weekend we begin a new year in the Church's calendar with the season of anticipation and waiting...... It's Advent once again! Our color changes to purple, we have a special wreath displayed in the Sanctuary with three purple and one pink candle



marking off the weeks before Christmas. This year, this special season is a bit shorter because the 4th Sunday of Advent is the same day as Christmas Eve!

Many people ask about the origins of the Advent wreath. It began as a German custom back in the 1800s. It came to our country in the 1920s and '30s. As time went on, many households duplicated their own version of the Advent wreath for their families. A weekly lighting of the candle, a short prayer, and a reminder of what Advent was all about-waiting for the coming of Jesus.

Even though the color purple is used on priests' vestments and on banners, it is not meant to be a penitential season like that of Lent. It is directed more toward being patient and anticipating Christmas with Jesus' birth, who is the Light of the World! It is to redirect us from the hustle and bustle of Christmas shopping to a sense of peace. The more candles we light, the more light we have reminding us that Christmas is near. A wonderful thought is to embrace how we can individually bring that light here to all we meet. How will we reflect His light this year?

Virtus Class for

Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- 1. Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years)

Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:

- 1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>
 - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first-time registrant.
 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization from the drop down list select Rockville Centre Safe Environment.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - e. Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
- 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop, you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide yourSocial Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee by the Diocese.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the "submit" button.

The next class offered at Holy Cross will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 6th at 6pm</u>. Please register for this class from the Virtus website. No walk-ins will be admitted. Please contact Tricia Clarke at 631-265-2200 x112 for more information.
