# IT REALLY IS GOOD NEWS

As you have probably heard, the word "gospel" can be translated as "good news." We are used to hearing a gospel passage at every Mass. While the words may be spoken, there is always the possibility that their full impact and significance can be missed. While we recognize the tradition and holiness of these passages, their relevance might be downplayed because of how old they are. But God's word is truly timeless.

I don't know why, but the power and strength of the scripture readings for the past few months have been abundantly rich and life-giving for me. A little over two months ago we heard the powerful Sermon on the Mount passage from Matthew's Gospel. Then beginning in Lent we heard the great stories from the "Cycle A" readings from John: the woman at the well, the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus. We are taught acceptance, forgiveness, healing, hope, and new life. How we long for such messages in the midst of the chaos and craziness of our lives and world.

This week we celebrate the greatest days in the Church year. Can we allow the brokenness and suffering in our world to be overshadowed by the awesome story of Jesus' dying and rising? The celebrations of Holy Week allow us to see the grace of God at work in our lives, even in the midst of hard times.

- There are many people hungering for God's presence. On Holy Thursday we are reminded of the gift of the Eucharist. Not only is Christ present to us in the breaking of the bread, but we are given the witness of washing feet as a reminder that it is in humble service we encounter God's presence.
- There is violence, injustice, and suffering in our world. On Good Friday we are reminded of Jesus' road to Calvary. When we stand before the cross, we not only remind ourselves of Jesus' sacrifice but of our own brokenness.
- There are people waiting for so much, including peace. Holy Saturday is a day of holy waiting. In the absence of the sacraments, we are reminded that longing and anticipation are necessary parts of life.
- There are times when new life and hope break into our lives. We need to seek and allow those moments when we can rejoice in the living waters that flow to us through the Risen Christ. Easter will come; He is Risen! Hope is real and hope can bring life.

Allow these days of Holy Week to be a font of life. They are not just days we have to get through prior to Easter. It is the great story of life in which we share. May these days take hold of our hearts and enable us to be a people of life and hope.



### **Holy Week for Children**

During the holiest week of the Church year, we remember what Jesus did for us on Good Friday. Children and their families are invited to commemorate this important day at a special prayer service, designed especially for our youngest parishioners.

### **LITURGY BYTES**

### Those 3 Days!

What is so great about these three days? First of all, these three days are also referred to as the Triduum (which means three days in Latin). They are part of the liturgical seasons of the Church year and actually a high point on the calendar. When you add the word **Paschal**, it makes it quite clear that these three days are about the dying and rising of Jesus Christ, known as the Paschal mystery.



The second Vatican Council saw these great three days as part of the 1970 Roman Missal where they were now part of the liturgical year and are celebrated as the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. Actually, designation of the Triduum as a separate liturgical season occurred in 1969, separating it from the Lenten and Easter seasons.

Holy Thursday this year occurs on April 6<sup>th</sup> with the Mass of the Lord's Supper here at Holy Cross beginning at 8 PM. This liturgy recalls what took place at the Last Supper: institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. Parishioners have their feet washed because this is what Jesus did. The tabernacle is emptied at the conclusion of Mass, with a holy hour of adoration. The altar is stripped of cloths and flowers, preparing for Good Friday.

*Good Friday* is the following day, April 7<sup>th</sup>. The service here begins at 3 PM and consists of the reading of the Passion, the Solemn Intercessions, Veneration of the Cross, and distribution of Communion which was reserved from Holy Thursday.

Holy Saturday is April 8<sup>th</sup>, with the Easter Vigil at 8 PM. It is the culmination of the Triduum where we go from darkness to light, reflecting on our salvation history, welcoming new members into the Church and singing the *Gloria* and the *Alleluia* once again. When we remember the history of our salvation, God's saving love is made real in our midst; in the Eucharist, past and future become present at the foot of the cross. More than any other time in the liturgical year, the liturgies of the Paschal Triduum invite us to remember **who we are** and **whose we are**.


Eat Simply



### Spring Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing. And so, we introduce the "Spring Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it will be offered initially on a quarterly basis.
