THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD

Three years ago at this time we were in the midst of the shutdown. For Sunday Mass the only three people in the building were Brian for music, Vinny for livestreaming and yours truly. This weekend we hear the familiar gospel story of the "Road to Emmaus." It was on that occasion, three years ago, that we began the Mass with a ceremonial walk up the driveway from Nichols Road into the Worship Area. We made that unusual procession to the tune of the Beatles' song "Long and Winding Road." It seemed to be an appropriate song for where we found ourselves at that time. We have moved beyond the greatest challenges of those days, but for each of us the path of faith continues. We face the disappointments and joys of our lives, and we seek to see the hand of God in all we do. As we continue to move through this season, we open ourselves to the power and gift of the Risen Lord touching our lives. Today's gospel reminds us we may not always immediately recognize the presence of the Lord. But, the reality is, the Lord is with us. Moments like the breaking of the bread as well as other insights into our lives help us to realize the Lord journeys with us. May these days continue to be a source of hope and life.

I have been speaking with a number of my brother pastors. We all had a similar experience with Holy Week and Easter. Uniformly, attendance numbers were up noticeably from last year. Although there were more folks attending, those numbers did not lead to an increase in the collections. Most pastors noted a slight decline in donations. We held about even from last year. There may be many factors that explain this, but it seems reasonable to assume that folks are working with tighter budgets at home as the cost of so many necessities has increased. I am grateful to the generosity of so many who keep us in a relatively stable financial position.

Does anyone like to weld as a hobby? We have an old wagon that is used around the garden and at my house. Unfortunately, it is getting wobbly and one piece of steel that controls the steering has rusted out. I think it just needs a little ingenuity, know-how and the right tools to get the old buggy back on the trail. If you can help with this, please let me know.

These days are just exploding with life as trees, bushes and nature are finally waking up. It is a beautiful time to celebrate rejuvenation in all that surrounds us. Of course, for those who suffer from allergies, some of the beauty gets lost in sneezing and wheezing, but I hope they are still joyful days for you.

LITURGY BYTES

The Offertory

Have you ever brought up the gifts of bread and wine at Mass? Sometimes people who have the Mass intention will ask to do it. Most weeks, the ushers seek out people to do this or, on some occasions, will bring up the gifts themselves along with the weekly offerings. You might ask, why is this so important? First of all, next time at Mass, listen to the words of the Priest at the conclusion of the offertory: "Pray brothers and sisters that **my sacrifice and yours** may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." These words call to mind that what just happened in the offertory is a significant sacrifice of the baptized people gathered for Mass. Naturally, this is distinct from the sacrifice of Jesus about to be represented on the altar through the prayers of the priest.



The reforms from the second Vatican Council allowed this important part of the Mass to have a greater prominence after years of decline. In the early Church, sacrificial references to the Eucharist are present in writings of St. Clement of Rome and St. Justin Martyr. After continued development of the offertory with prayers and processions, it saw a minimization during the medieval period. It was much later that Pope Paul VI insisted upon giving the offertory a new and special prominence. He said this to the synod of Bishops in 1967: "*The offertory should be given a special prominence so that the faithful may exercise their special role as offerers.*"

As the gifts of bread and wine are brought forward in procession by the people and then slightly elevated upon the altar by the priest, we have a key opportunity to participate in the Eucharist by joining our individual spiritual sacrifices to Jesus through this ritual moment of our celebration. Perhaps recalling something from the past week that was difficult or particular intentions that we carry could be part of our own offering. The specific role each person plays in the drama of life is now caught up in the one sacrifice of Jesus in the midst of each Eucharist celebrated throughout the entire world. So, consider how important and significant a reminder the offertory is for all of us to participate as unique offerers each week. May we look to bring up the gifts at Mass more frequently.

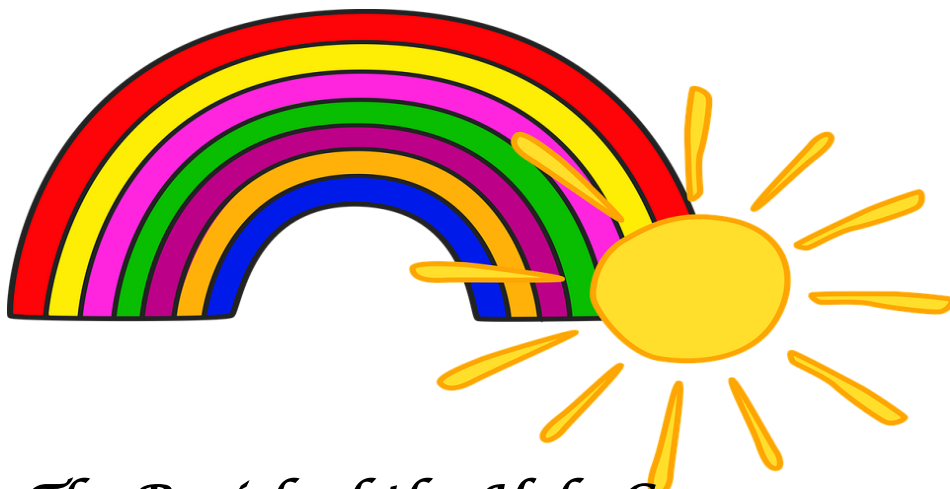

The one hour training will help participants understand mental health as an integral part of overall health, prevalence of mental illness, and risk & protective factors; promote help-seeking behavior, recovery and self-care.

Goals of the training:

- Increase basic knowledge of mental health to help reduce stigma.
- Understand Mental Health as a continuum of wellness that defines us every day – it is illness, recovery and all of the space in between.

Why is this important?

Consider this: the median time between the onset of mental illness (when symptoms first appear) and when an individual gets appropriate treatment is **10 years**.

During that time, a person is likely experiencing periods of increased symptomology and periods of wellness. Mental Health and recovery are dependent on an individual's ability to recognize and manage where he/she is each day on the continuum between wellness and illness and take care accordingly, an important piece to quality of life. **Education and early intervention promotes wellness.**

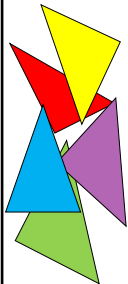

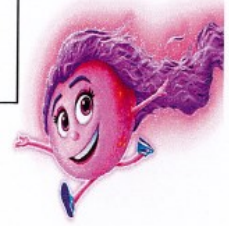
