IN THE LIVING WATERS

From the time I was six years old, my family went on a summer vacation to a modest resort in the White Mountains of New Hampshire. The activity that occupied most of my time was hiking in the woods with my brother. Many of the trails intertwined and, sooner or later, led to what was known as the Baker River. It had a fast-moving current with lots of rocks, waterfalls and pools. We spent endless hours getting to, exploring, and splashing around in the river. There were even rumors that there was gold in the Baker River. We did our best to pan for it with a frisbee, but unfortunately that coveted nugget escaped our grasp. Our adventures at the river were unique experiences that became an important part of our memory book of youth.

We loved being there for our annual visit, but that was not the only time visions of the river filled our minds. Once we returned home, we would recall past adventures. In anticipation of our next trip, we would make new plans. To this day, memories of fresh air, icy waters, and the great outdoors bring me back to an idyllic moment in life. Experiences like this are priceless. I will always be grateful to my mother who saw the wisdom in making something like this part of our upbringing. Vacation memories are fine, but we can come to know something even greater—God's presence. And we need not have to travel to a far away place or rely on childhood memories to be fed and renewed in life. This brings us to what we do today: celebrate Easter.

We are familiar with the story. Those who knew Jesus saw him put to death. They came to his tomb to mourn, and his body was gone. Beyond all logic and expectation, a story unfolded that indeed he has risen from the dead. We can appreciate the intensity of that story for those who were part of it. But can we allow the miracle that happened so many years ago to bring us life?

The story of the Risen Lord is the story of a never-ending river of life. To those who are weary, Christ brings strength. To those who are broken, Christ heals. To those who are torn by sin, Christ forgives. If we seek, if we trust, if we allow, Christ can change our hearts and lives. There are too many places where we can find ourselves immersed in pessimism and negativity. We can drown in hatred. This must always be a place where we allow promises of light and hope to touch our hearts even in the most difficult of times. Living waters are here in our midst.

Come to the waters of life. Come to this celebration. Come to this community of faith. The gifts God offers are overflowing and beyond measure. How blessed we are to be able to receive. He is Risen, and our hearts are made new.

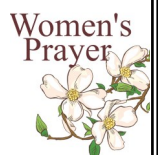


Women's Prayer Group

The Great 50 Days!



Happy Easter! May the joy of Christ's Resurrection remain in your hearts. The word "Easter" comes from the old English word and simply means the "east." The sun rises in the east, bringing light, warmth and hope, and is a symbol for Christians of the Risen Lord who is the true light of the world. The Paschal candle is the central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is lit throughout the Easter season at all liturgical celebrations.

Many people ask why Easter is a different date each year. Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon that occurs after the spring equinox. As a result, Easter could be as early as March 22 and as late as April 25. This season is most important when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead. The season lasts 50 days culminating with the feast of Pentecost. It is characterized by the joy of glorified life and the victory over death expressed when we say or sing ALLELUIA, JESUS CHRIST IS RISEN TODAY!

There is something festive in the environment of our church with numerous spring flowers adorning the sanctuary, colorful banners of joy, and the return of the *Gloria*, whether sung or recited to our celebration of Mass. We renew our baptismal promises and are sprinkled with holy water to add to the celebration. Our music is upbeat and joyful once again.

New life is all around us. Consider doing something new to revitalize yourself and to respond to the needs of your parish. We have many areas of parish life that need more hands. Perhaps, during this Easter season you will be encouraged to take a leap into ministry here at Holy Cross.

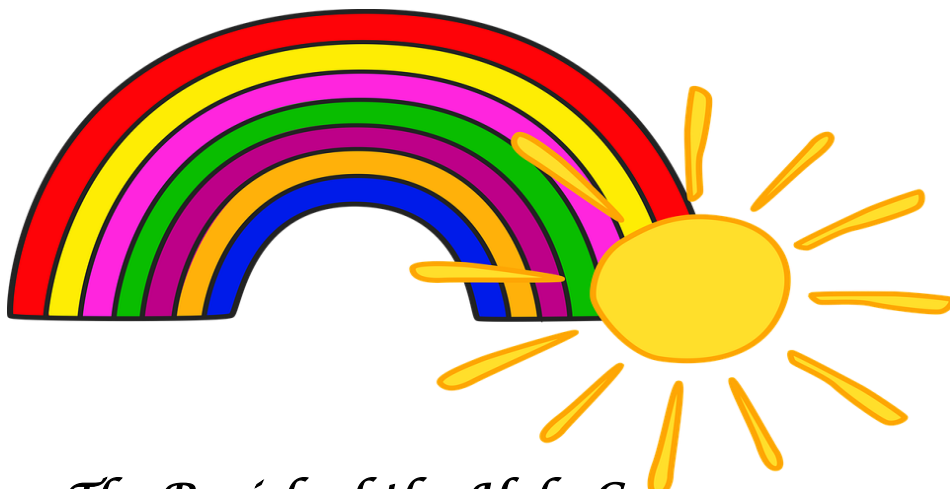

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

Every Easter, you and I are reminded of the power of the Paschal Mystery. Commemorating the celebration of the first Eucharist at the Mass of the Lord's Supper, walking with Jesus on the road to Calvary on Good Friday in the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion, and celebrating Christ's triumphant conquering of sin and death in the Mass of the Resurrection on Easter is a potent reminder of God's love for us.

During this season of Easter and this time of National Eucharistic Revival, it becomes even clearer to us that the Paschal Mystery is not a mere historical event, but a mystery in which we are privileged to participate every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Easter sequence, we sing: "Christians, to the Paschal Victim, offer your thankful praises!" The word, *Eucharist*, which means, *thanksgiving*, implies that every time the Church gathers for the celebration of the Mass, she offers an act of "thankful praise" to the Lord. In this act of offering thanksgiving to God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we as a priestly people offer the sacrifices of our lives with the offering of the Body and Blood of the Lord, by which our sacrifices take on new value and meaning (see, CCC, §1368).

Love is central to the mission of the Church. The sacrifices that we offer to God each day and in the celebration of the Eucharist are an expression of our love for him and for his people. When Christ appeared to Peter and the apostles on the Sea of Galilee after his Resurrection, he asked Peter: "Do you love me?" As he responds, "yes, Lord" to that three-fold questioning, Christ calls him to mission: "feed my lambs...tend my sheep...feed my sheep" (see John 21:15-19) Like Peter, you and I are faced with that same question from the Lord: "do you love me?" In other words, do we take the contemplative time that our hearts yearn for to renew our love for the Lord? In the offering of our time in prayer we are reminded of the very nature of God's love. Through that experience of true love, we realize that as disciples of Christ, you and I are called to mission: to bring the love of Christ to world; to glorify the Lord by our lives; to extend the Divine Mercy to those who suffer; to let the earth shake with the joy of the Resurrection!

Every human heart is created to love. As we grow deeper in our devotion to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus as a Diocese this June, we ask the Lord to strengthen our hearts to love as Jesus loves and for the zeal to proclaim to those we encounter that "God is Love" (1 John 4:8,16).

I wish you and your families a blessed Easter Season!


