WOUNDED IN CHRIST'S LOVE

Last week was a beautiful celebration. The music, the homily, and the procession all came together gracefully to create an uplifting and joyful celebration. One particular detail that was very meaningful for some parishioners came about in a coincidental way. The song that was sung during the procession and prior to the final blessing in the courtyard was "Holy Ground." It was Brian, our Music Director, who chose the song. Unbeknownst to him, that was the same song that was sung when the founding parishioners first gathered on this site for the occasion of a blessing and groundbreaking. Some of our current parishioners were here on that defining day. It was a moment that took them back to the first days of Holy Cross.

Quite honestly, there was an abundance of work and details that went into planning and bringing to life a day like that. There was an element of exhaustion by the end of the day, but also tremendous satisfaction. There is no other event in the course of the week that touches as many people as our weekend Masses do. It is a wise investment of time and effort to make that time as prayerful and meaningful as possible.

On Tuesday of this week, we had our annual Team/Staff planning meeting for next year. One of the decisions made was to continue to identify special moments throughout the year and make those Sunday celebrations as rich as possible. We made plans to make the weekend of September 16/17 one of the dates. This is the weekend that coincides closest with September 14, the Exaltation of the Cross, which is our feast day. We are also looking to do thematic and focused celebrations during the season of Lent.

The month of June is called the month of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This might strike some folks as some old Catholic idea that does not connect to our experience today. But, in fact, it is a rich image that can bring us more deeply into the mystery and gift of God's love. Certainly, the connection between the heart and love does not need abundant explanation. For me the power comes as the heart is often depicted as crowned with thorns, pierced and bleeding. While this image may strike some as too graphic or painful, it does open the door to a deep insight into the Paschal mystery. Jesus inevitably had to face suffering and the cross. We, in our lives, inevitably will face suffering and the cross. The more we understand our own brokenness as a place of union with Jesus, the more we can appreciate redemption and new life.

The heart of Jesus is the focal point of love, suffering, and redemption. Today we look at the brokenness of our lives. Next week we look at the hope and new life that comes to us through the Risen Christ. We share in the powerful life of the Paschal mystery.

These calls are made by RSVP (Retired Senior Volunteer Program), senior volunteers who have been screened and trained. The volunteers work under the supervision of an RSVP staff member and regularly participate in ongoing seminars designed to build skills and gain knowledge of the senior population and community resources.

LITURGY BYTES

June Saints – Part 2



This week we will focus our reflection on *St. John the Baptist*, whose feast is celebrated on *June 24th*, and *Sts. Peter and Paul*, who the Church honors on *June 29th*.

John the Baptist was called by Jesus to be the greatest of all who preceded him (Luke 7:28). As we know, John spent much time in the desert. He began to announce the coming of the kingdom and to call everyone to reform. His main purpose was to prepare the way for Jesus. John attracted many people to the banks of the Jordan River. Some even thought that he might be the Messiah. John constantly talked of Jesus as the Messiah and even baptized Jesus. After this, Jesus entered publicly into the community of those awaiting the Messiah (Matthew 3:15). St. John's attitude towards Jesus was, *He must increase; I must decrease* (John 3:30). The scriptures during the Advent season focus quite a bit on John and all he did to prepare the people for Jesus.

Sts. Peter and Paul are both vastly different men and important to the history of the Church. In the year 67 AD, they were martyred in Rome during the persecutions ordered by the emperor Nero against the Christians. One was crucified upside down and the other beheaded. You might wonder why the Church chose to honor both of them on the same day. Actually, the feast was made to divert attention from a pagan feast on that day and make it a Christian celebration.

Peter was an ardent and impulsive person and expected the Messiah to be not only a spiritual guide, but also a warrior. The personality and charisma of Jesus conquered Peter, even though he denied Jesus three times. On the other hand, Paul never knew Jesus. He persecuted Christians but was struck blind one day and converted. He journeyed through many regions preaching and writing to these communities. Actually, Paul was known as Jesus' first missionary. It does make sense that both these men are celebrated together because of their common bond to spread the Gospel message!

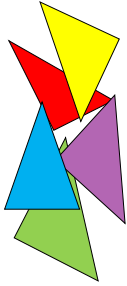

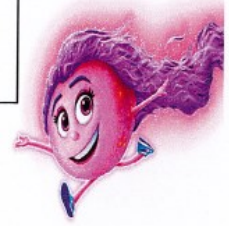

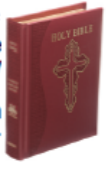
