

# REDEEMED IN CHRIST'S LOVE

I suppose I have done a potentially risky thing. Last week I powerfully reminded everyone of the power of the cross and how it is present in our lives and in our world. A few people commented to me how they found last week to be a challenge. Now I have placed myself in the position of having to make an even more powerful statement of the power of the Risen Christ. How does a person do that? Without being overly dramatic, I need to do what St. Paul did. There is no formula to offer or evidence to point to. All I can do is try to speak with conviction how I know what I received was real and my belief that the gift is given time and time again.

Almost thirty years ago, in the context of a healing service as part of a retreat in a mountain camp in northern New Mexico, under the guidance of a retreat director I was touched by what can only be described as the healing love of Christ. Sadness, grief, loneliness, fear and confusion all melted away in a moment of unmistakable presence. Some things that I had been grappling with since I was a child and other issues that emerged in my early adulthood, in a moment were all enveloped in God's loving embrace. I didn't think the tears would ever stop, and a part of me wanted them to flow forever.

Throughout my life I have been richly blessed. I have been given opportunities to travel that included some remarkable experiences of God's presence: numerous trips to our national parks, men's retreats, Religious Education gatherings, etc. I don't mind getting on a plane, traveling to distant corners of our country and allowing these jaunts to become moments of grace. Not everyone has the ability, desire, or freedom to fly the friendly skies on a whim. But, time and time again, good and holy people keep returning to this holy space at Holy Cross. All people have the desire and need to know that transforming grace of our Lord.

My prayer is that I am able to create a space to foster and allow moments of holiness to unfold. The sacraments are an immeasurable gift, but I don't have a cookbook to follow. There are no universal formulas. I know I can't do it all. There needs to be an openness and desire in the hearts of those who come. But, in the end, it is a gift of God's grace. It is undeserved, it makes us feel unworthy, but it is real.

The Church also offers gifts such as celebrations of The Body and Blood of Christ and the Sacred Heart of Jesus to foster moments of grace. We have tried to use these weeks to be moments when God may speak to your heart. Thank you for your trust and openness. These weeks may or may not have been holy for you. Remain open to the countless ways in which Christ may touch your heart.

Perhaps next week I will try something a little lighter. How's about making some balloon animals?

Our monthly Holy Hour will take place next Saturday, July 1st, from 3:45-4:45 PM. Come spend some time before the Blessed Sacrament praying for God's gift of life to be recognized by all.

# **LITURGY BYTES**

## July Saints

Today we will explore some of our July saints beginning with St. Thomas the Apostle whose feast is July 3<sup>rd</sup>. He is the patron saint of architects. He was one of the apostles and a dedicated follower of Christ. He is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of Jesus by his unwillingness to believe that the other apostles saw the Risen Lord on that first Easter Sunday. Because of his unbelief, he is dubbed "doubting Thomas." A few days later, when Jesus appeared for the second time, Thomas was present to put his fingers in the place where the nails were placed. At this, Thomas became convinced of the truth of the Resurrection and said: "My Lord and My God," thus making a public profession of Faith in the divinity of Jesus. In the Gospels, he is also mentioned to be with Jesus (post Resurrection) when a miraculous catch of fish occurred. These are the only accounts about Thomas in the New Testament. He was speared to death because of his beliefs at a place called Calamine.

Our next July saint is Kateri Tekakwitha whose feast is celebrated July 14th. She is known as the "Lily of the Mohawks," born near a place where Jesuit priests were martyred in Auriesville, New York. Her mother was a Christian Algonquin, taken and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan. At the age of 4, she lost both parents and her little brother due to the smallpox epidemic. Because of the epidemic, she was left partially blind and disfigured. She was adopted by an uncle who became chief. The uncle tried to marry her off, but she refused. She eventually was converted by missionaries, which was against her uncle's wishes, and was baptized with the name Kateri (Catherine) on Easter Sunday. Now she was treated as a slave. However, that did not stop her love for God and all people. She was always in danger. With the advice of a priest, one night she left and journeyed to a Christian Indian village outside of Montreal. She remained there, giving herself totally to God with long hours of prayer and penance. She even took a vow of virginity but continued with her ordinary life praying for the conversion of her nation. She died the day before Holy Thursday. She was beautified in 1980 and canonized in 2012.




