

JUMPING INTO JUNE

This past week I took some of my vacation days and headed out to the Southwest. My travels took me from Albuquerque to Phoenix. Most of the time was a solo road trip which I always enjoy, particularly in that corner of the world. I also made plans to spend some time with a friend. These days were a welcome respite after a busy May. The summer may not be the best time to visit Arizona as the heat takes over each day. But it is still a beautiful place to visit, and I always delight in the solitude and scenery.

Over the next three weeks there will be a thematic connection in our Sunday liturgies. (My homilies may be a tad longer than usual.) The Easter Season, which we just concluded, is a rich time to celebrate the Risen Lord. The Sundays that follow are also very rich in meaning, in particular Pentecost, The Body and Blood of Christ, and Sacred Heart Sunday. I hope these days touch your heart in a meaningful way.

When we look at the events that surround us in our communities, our nation, and the world, we can be overwhelmed with fear, anger and negativity. I don't pretend that coming to Mass is a magical pill that makes everything right. But I do believe we need to spiritually fortify ourselves for the challenges we face. We need to have a spiritual point of reference. We need to embrace the message of hope and life that we proclaim. We need to trust that the message of Jesus is relevant in seeking a path to peace and harmony. What we do here is not meant to be a break from the rest of life. Instead, what we do here is meant to weave its way into everything that happens to help keep our souls in balance.

I know I have a biased view, but I can't imagine how one tries to sort out the stuff of life without the perspective of faith as a foundation. There is no way that any one person can hold together or find a definitive solution to all we face. And so, we continually offer the complexity of our own lives and world to the one who can hold it all together: our loving God.

This day (June 4) will always hold a special place in my heart as it is the anniversary of my ordination to priesthood. This year marks thirty-five years. There are times when priesthood has its challenges, but in the end it is a rich privilege and gift. I feel blessed in being able to try to bring God's word to life and bring hope and life to the spiritual journey of so many people. I am deeply grateful in being able to share that gift at this time with the good people of Holy Cross.

Beginning Monday, we will once again celebrate daily Mass in the chapel. It has been over three years, and it is time to return to that holy space.

Daily Mass will take place in the chapel beginning Monday, June 5th.



His Body Broken . . . We Journey to the Cross




- We focus on the Sacred Wounds of Jesus and our own woundedness



Month of the Sacred Heart

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is honored by the Church during the month of June. The image of God's love is revealed in the pierced heart of His Son which is the popular image we are familiar with. It is the symbol of a love that conquers sin and transcends death, the symbol of the one who loved us to the end.



In my reading about the Sacred Heart, I have come across some points of reflection you may find interesting. The Church was born from the pierced side of Jesus on the cross. In prayer, we contemplate the pierced heart of our Savior and his incredible love. We also think about mercy, compassion, and love that God has bestowed upon us. St. Paul prayed that Christ dwell in the hearts of the community at Ephesus through faith and that these people might know the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge. He went on to say that when Christ dwells in our hearts, when we know his love deeply, we are moved to live the commandments of love of God and neighbor. We should be moved and motivated by the Sacred Heart of Jesus to *open our hearts* to Him, being filled with love for our sisters and brothers.

The Church born from the pierced heart of Jesus has a mission in the world to proclaim the redeeming love of God in Christ. Our mission, our work, is to proclaim love, salvation, redemption, and eternal life. *The Sacred Heart is the image that expresses our mission*. Our goal as Church should be to lead people to encounter this love.

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is also Eucharistic. It finds its summit at Mass where we lift up our hearts to the Lord. At Mass we are nourished at the banquet of our Redeemer's Body and Blood. The Eucharist has been called the outstanding gift of the Heart of Jesus — the heart that gives life to the Church and to all of us. Perhaps, this year we will awaken what the image of the Sacred Heart is and means for each of us.


