## WELCOME BACK, ORDINARY TIME

Well, we have finally moved beyond Easter and Pentecost. The Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ and our special focus on the Sacred Heart are now behind us. Once again we find ourselves in the season of Ordinary Time. While the celebration of our holiest days are always uplifting, there is something about the routine of weekly Mass that is comforting in addition to being holy. I enjoy these months of the year. Most of our lives are not filled with special celebrations, and there is wisdom in having that reflected in our liturgy.

We have now moved from the profound to the ridiculous. The highlight of this week at the parish was diagnosing and addressing a cesspool issue. For the past few weeks, there has been an ever increasing foul odor in the hallway outside the main office. At first, we thought we had a blocked or cracked waste line, but fortunately that proved not to be the case. The discovery was made that our cesspools are at their capacity. I was amazed to learn our building has a cesspool; I would have assumed we are connected to a sewer. I know for certain it was never pumped out in the last ten years. Nobody here can ever remember it being pumped out. I guess we were on borrowed time and were due. So, after a major pump-out and about \$2,300 later we should be in good shape to flush to our hearts content.

This will be a bit of an interesting week for me as I have been summoned for jury duty. I have been told that the likelihood of me being chosen for a case is remote, but we will see. I will check in daily to see if my number even gets called. I assume it is going to be a slow week in the courts with the holiday in the middle of the week.

I received mostly positive feedback regarding our liturgies of the last few weeks. But one comment in particular touched my heart. A man said to me as he was leaving, "I'm so grateful I found this church." To know that we may be touching the hearts of those who come and spiritually feeding souls is a humbling and powerful realization. I acknowledge I am part of the formula, but there are so many other necessary components: good music, an inviting environment, a spirit of welcome, etc. We cannot take for granted this community of faith that we share and the part that each of us plays in it being a reflection of God's kingdom.

I was delighted to spot the first fireflies of the season last Sunday. You know it is summer once the fireflies are around. My childhood memories of summer include those happy little insects fluttering around. I hope you are able to make fun plans for the summer. Enjoy the Independence Day holiday, but pray for our Nation.

## Let's Build a Labyrinth

You start at the beginning, and as long as you keep moving forward you will come to the end. There is a large space at the back of the garden where one can be built.

Help is needed in two areas: planning and construction.


#### Planning:

- > Determine size
- > Determine foundation materials: gravel, wood chips, etc?
- Choose material for pathway: river rocks, seashells, pavers, etc? How much is needed?
- > Plan surrounding landscaping
- Signage
- Budgeting
- > Organize volunteers
- > Schedule workdays, delivery of materials, etc.

#### **Construction:**

- > Remove a tree and cut back surrounding weeds
- Removing grass (rototiller)
- > Level Ground
- > Build Foundation (gravel)
- Measure out design
- ➤ Mark pathway
- > Other enhancements such as benches, landscaping, etc.

# **LITURGY BYTES**

### **More July Saints**

St. Mary Magdalene is the most honored woman in the Bible, except for our Blessed Mother. She is not to be confused with the unnamed sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke's Gospel. Mary of Magdala was one of the many who assisted Jesus and the apostles. She stood at the foot of the cross with Jesus' Mother and was the official witness to His Resurrection, a privilege she was given. She is known as the Apostle to the Apostles. Her feast day is celebrated on July 22<sup>nd</sup>.



St. James' feast occurs on July 25th. He's the brother of John the Evangelist and is also known as the son of Zebedee. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father on a fishing boat. We also know that James witnessed the Transfiguration, the raising to life of Jairus' daughter, and the agony in the garden. Sometimes, he is referred to as James the Greater. He was the first of the apostles to be martyred by King Herod. This James should not be confused with the James that wrote the letter of James in the New Testament or James the Lesser.

On July 26th, the Church celebrates the parents of our Blessed Mother – Sts. Joachim and Anne. Actually, we know nothing factual about them except that they existed. Their heroism and holiness is apparent from the whole family atmosphere that surrounds Mary in the Scriptures. We see in Mary many generations of prayerful people and the strong religious traditions of her people. Her parents represent generations of the faithful who perform their duties and practice their faith. They are very special grandparents who are examples of great wisdom for us all.
