# **BEYOND OUR FOUR WALLS**

One of my summer tasks is to visit all of our homebound parishioners to whom we bring Holy Communion. This is what occupied most of my time this past week. It involves a bunch of visits, but it is a humbling and beautiful way to spend the week. It is remarkable to hear so many stories of how people feel deeply connected to Holy Cross even though the circumstances of their lives prevent them from getting here on a regular basis. In most instances, it is the Eucharistic Minister who is assigned to them that becomes their lifeline to the parish. It is heartening to consistently hear stories of people who are grateful for caring and committed ministers who reach out to them. Thank you to all our parishioners who are part of this ministry.

It is also important to acknowledge how much technology can be a part of ministry. It frequently happens that when I arrive at someone's home, the TV is turned onto CFN (our Catholic television station). The various Masses that are shown as well as the rosary and devotional prayers provide a stream of spiritual nourishment. I'm also touched by how many people stay connected to Holy Cross through our livestreaming of Mass. At one point in time, I would have resisted broadcasting our Masses, but they have become an important part of the lives of some of our parishioners. There is no limit on the numerous and creative ways the Spirit can be at work.

There is also an immeasurable contingent of people who identify Holy Cross as their spiritual home although they may not be here very often. For those of us who are here, I think we collectively wish they would be here. We understand there is a joy and energy that comes about in sharing what we do, and we want to share this font of life. We also realize we need the help of many to support and maintain what we do. We can't make people pray here or support us. We continue to do the best we can and allow the Spirit to be at work in the hearts of all.

On a different note, I have a big old clunker of an air conditioner at the house that cools the living room, dining room and kitchen. It is a unit that is mounted through the wall. While it often sounded like an idling Southwest 737, it did a good job of cooling those rooms. Unfortunately, last week it pooped out and stopped working. I have a small window unit for my bedroom, but the house is hot on these summer days. I'm looking into different options to resolve the situation. A few of these days I have been tempted to run outside and jump through the lawn sprinkler.
