

## **BLAST OFF WITH JESUS**

I feel a little bit like Francis Scott Key as I write this bulletin article. It is the evening of July 4th, and fireworks are blasting off all around me.

Vacation Bible School kicks off this week. This year the program has a "stellar/outer space" theme to it. We reached capacity of seventy-five campers and sixty older children who assist in the program. If you need to come to the parish this week, please be mindful there will be an abundance of activity with children both inside and out. We received a funeral for Monday, so the funeral and daily Mass will be celebrated together at 8:45 AM. Daily Mass for the remainder of the week has also been moved to 8:45 AM in the event we get another funeral. After Mass, the Chapel and Worship Area are limited to those involved with VBS until 1:00 PM. This is a safety precaution for our children, and we appreciate your cooperation.

If you come into the office area of the building, you may notice that it is brighter than it has been in the past. Last week we replaced all the old fluorescent fixtures in our offices with new energy efficient LED lighting units. The old units were beyond their life expectancy, and we were constantly changing light bulbs. The cost for this improvement was \$6,284 but we will be receiving back approximately \$1,800 in rebates. Thank you to all those who continue to support our repair and renovation fund.

The new HVAC units for the Worship Area should be arriving within the next few weeks. This will be a major repair. Again, I am grateful we have the funds to pay for it through our repair and renovation collections. On the other side, I'm not sure what to do with the colonnade in the courtyard. The lowest estimate to repair it came in at \$32,000, which is very high. I appreciate it is a labor intensive project to refinish each column, but that does not strike me as a good investment of our funds. I raised the idea (no pun intended) of having them removed. When I wrote about this a few weeks ago in the bulletin, I was surprised that I did not receive a single objection. As a preliminary step in pursuing their removal we cut away a section of paneling. Much to our surprise there is substantial structural steel in each column. Although we have not gotten any formal estimates for removal, we have been told this would be a major demolition project. So, for the moment, that project remains on hold.

This week's gospel extends the invitation for all who are weary to come to the Lord. That is an appropriate theme during this summer time. But it is not just about taking a break. It is Jesus saying, "take my yoke upon you and learn from me." A relationship with Christ does not mean an easy ride. It means journeying forward through the challenges of life knowing we are not alone. May we continue to allow the power and gift of Christ to touch our hearts.

# Let's Build a Labyrinth

A labyrinth is a circular meditative prayer walk. It is often mistaken for a maze. A maze has intersections where a decision needs to be made as to what direction to go. A labyrinth is a single path. You start at the beginning, and as long as you keep moving forward you will come to the end. There is a large space at the back of the garden where one can be built.

Help is needed in two areas: planning and construction.


#### Planning:

- > Determine size
- > Determine foundation materials: gravel, wood chips, etc?
- Choose material for pathway: river rocks, seashells, pavers, etc? How much is needed?
- > Plan surrounding landscaping
- Signage
- Budgeting
- > Organize volunteers
- > Schedule workdays, delivery of materials, etc.

#### **Construction:**

- > Remove a tree and cut back surrounding weeds
- Removing grass (rototiller)
- > Level Ground
- > Build Foundation (gravel)
- Measure out design
- ➤ Mark pathway
- > Other enhancements such as benches, landscaping, etc.

### More July Saints

Towards the end of July, we celebrate the feast of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. These three siblings were evidently close friends of Jesus. He came to their home as a welcomed guest.

The sisters felt free to call on Jesus at the time of their brother's death, even though it was dangerous

for Jesus to return to Judea at that time. **Martha** is known for her simple and yet strong statement of faith in Jesus, after her brother's death when she told Jesus: "Yes Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." Martha also was an active person, preparing meals for her guests and even getting a bit testy when no one was reaching out to help her. Even though Jesus realized that Martha worried about many things, he also commented about her sister, **Mary**, who was sitting at His feet, listening to His words: "Mary has chosen the better part."

Their brother, **Lazarus**, was in danger of being killed by the chief priests because they blamed him for the many Jews who were turning away and believing in Jesus because of all that Lazarus taught them. Many legends abound about the life of Lazarus after Jesus' death and resurrection. Some say he followed Peter to Syria, and others report he was with his sisters and ended up in Cyprus. It is there where he died peacefully serving as a Bishop for 30 years. In 2021, veneration for all three of these saints was combined and is now celebrated by the Church on **July 29**<sup>th</sup>. They are known as the patron saints of siblings.

May we follow the example of these saints and express hospitality and welcome to all who come before us!


