TEACHING BY EXAMPLE

To teach by example reveals certain aspects of the teacher. When we use that phrase it means more than just passing along information. People who do this are doing more than just completing a task; in some way they are sharing a part of their lives and who they are. Their teachings become a reflection of their integrity. Their actions and words are rooted in their values and beliefs.

I suggest to you that our teacher for the next several weeks is St. Peter. In three out of the next four weeks, the gospel story focuses on the relationship between Jesus and Peter. We may immediately associate Peter with great holiness as he was one of the disciples and was ultimately chosen to be the leader of the first church community. But woven into these remarkable aspects of his life is a hefty dose of his humanity. In the matter of three verses, he goes from being called the rock and foundation to being called Satan. That's quite a transformation! Much of what he says and does reveals the fears, doubts and weakness with which most of us can readily identify.

This week we hear about Peter and the disciples being in a boat when a late night storm catches them off guard. In the midst of this frightening moment, Jesus appears to them walking on the water. This is a miracle unto itself, but it does not end there. Jesus extends an unbelievable invitation to Peter, that he too can walk on the water. Amazingly, it does work for a few steps, but then fear kicks in and Peter begins to sink. Jesus is there to catch him and raise him to safety.

Do you ever feel that life is frightening and overwhelming? Do you ever feel like you are struggling to keep your head above the water of life? Do you ever feel like crying out in fear or uncertainty, "Lord, save me?" If yes, don't worry. You are in good company. The brilliance of Peter is that he is not some kind of spiritual superman, but rather he is an ordinary man trying to sort out the stuff of life and the man of Jesus. Yes, he is a man of faith, but he is also a man of folly. Jesus understands him and remains patient with him for the journey.

Sometimes we tend to put people on pedestals and recognize only virtues and success. While that may be a great compliment to the individual, it makes the person feel superior and distant from us. Peter is not that kind of teacher. He stumbles around the sloppiness of life like all of us do. But in the end, he gives tremendous witness to his faith. There is great comfort and strength in embracing the fullness of who he was and how he lived his life. May we learn well from him, as he is a man of holiness as well as one of human limitation. The path he walks creates a space for us to walk in our humanity as well as our holiness.

LITURGY BYTES

<u>August Saint</u>

August 11th is the feast day of St. Clare, one of my personal favorites.
She is known for her powerful devotion to the Eucharist. Her name came from something her mother heard before she gave birth — that she

would bring forth a light which would illumine the world more clearly. The baby was named Chiara, which in Italian means "brightness" and is translated in English as Clare. Clare was soon to become the holy Clare, born of noble birth, and yet ready to give it all up once she was strongly influenced by the example of St. Francis of Assisi. She refused to marry and then made vows received by St. Francis. Eventually, she became head of the second religious order established by Francis, known today as the Poor Clares. They lived in a convent at San Damiano. Later on, Clare was joined by her own mother and sister.

Here are three famous quotes of Clare's that are rich in wisdom for each of us to reflect on:

"Love that does not know of suffering is not worthy of the name" – accepting hardship with a good and patient attitude, offering it to God is her suggestion. Daily praying the Morning Offering is something we can all do.

"Do not be disturbed by the clamor of the world, which passes like a shadow" – it is easy for us to be distracted by the burdens of life, the hostilities and unrest in the world today, etc. etc. – just watch the news! Clare reminds us that everything passes except for God. Always try to bring ourselves back to God who is always there for us. We need to trust and realize the protective strength of God.

"Blessed be you, My God, for having created me" – Clare recommends repeating this verse daily to enable us to have a spirit of gratitude. Isn't it a wonderful thing to remember that God planned each and everyone of us. When some days get us down and life weighs heavily upon us, the one thing that never changes is GOD!! Our God is an awesome God!


