

LIVING IN THE PRESENT MOMENT (PART 2)

Because of vacation schedules, I had to provide three weeks of bulletin articles several weeks in advance. I continue in this spiritual reflection which began last week, which speaks of the power of living in the present moment.

Whenever summer rolls around, I delight in memories of my first vacation as a child. As I have shared with you in the past, beginning when I was six years old, my family used to go to a little resort in the White Mountains of New Hampshire for a one-week getaway. There are so many details of that first trip that I recall with vivid clarity. My mother did not feel capable of making the drive herself. So, we traveled from our home in New Hyde Park to the subway station in Jamaica. From there the train took us to the Port Authority bus terminal to begin an eight-hour ride on a Trailways bus. The final few miles were in a car that the resort would send to meet us at the bus stop. For those days, it was like the world was spinning on a different axis. We got to play all day, have meals served to us in the dining room, and gaze at endless stars at night. For our family, that was an epic adventure that took us to a magical place. While we were there, worries did not exist, it was only the joy of the moment that occupied our time. I think those memories are so deeply etched in my heart because, without realizing it at the time, I was delighting in the present moment.

I'm sure I'm not alone in having memories like this. For some of you, it may be those first celebrations of Christmas that you recall. Perhaps it was the family gathered around the table on Thanksgiving. Or, what about that first day you ventured off to that place called school. There is something about the child's mindset that lends itself to these kinds of moments. Innocence and simplicity keep us rooted in the place where we are. For those of you who have young children in your lives, you know how often they ground you because of their outlook on life. Don't forget those lessons you learned so long ago about how rich life can be.

These kinds of moments are not limited to small children. As adults we can have defining moments that deeply ground us. I suspect that for those of you who have had children, I doubt you were wondering how the Yankees did or were looking up stock quotes at the moment of your child's birth. You were deeply rooted in that moment, and the moment will live on forever in your hearts.

To lose the present moment is to lose the only moment we will ever have to embrace life. Don't limit those occasions to childhood memories or only the "big things" that happen in life. Remain rooted in life. Three weeks ago we were reminded that Peter said, "Lord, it is good that we are here" in the midst of the transfiguration. May that phrase become more than someone else's quote, and in fact become the way in which we look at virtually any moment that comes along. More to come . . .

LITURGY BYTES—A PSALM PRAYER

Last week we wrote about the beauty of the psalms. This week I invite you to try something a little different. It is called personalizing the psalm as you pray. I chose Psalm 139 to use. As you might have noticed below, I have left blank lines throughout the psalm. When the blank line appears, simply add your first name. You will make this psalm your very own. I do hope you will notice how deeply moving it is when it is re-written so that God addresses you personally. If you like it, try it with other psalms for a different and personal experience of prayer.

Psalm 139 , I have searched you and known you. I know when you sit down and when you rise up; I discern your thoughts from far away. I search out your path and your lying down, and am acquainted with all your ways. Even before a word is on your tongue, I know it completely. I hem you in, _____, behind and before and lay my hand upon you. Where can you go from my spirit? Or where can you flee from my presence, If you ascend to heaven, I am there; if you make your bed in the nether world, I am there. If you take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea. even there my hand shall lead you, and my right hand shall hold you fast. For, _____, it was I who formed your inward parts; knit you together in your mother's womb, my eyes beheld your uniformed substance. In my book were written all the days that were formed for you, when none of them as yet existed.


Some Thank Yous from Parish Outreach!
