SIZZLING SEPTEMBER

As I write this article I'm looking at the thermometer hitting 93 degrees. It sounds like much of this week will be in that range. School may be back in session, but summer weather continues.

Vacation schedules are now complete here at the parish, and I no longer need to write the bulletin article weeks in advance. Here's a quick summation of my August vacation. I spent 2 ½ days in Florida with my sister and brother-in-law. I spent a full day with my three-year-old grandniece. It was a blast of a day, but exhausting. At least now she can call me Uncle Mike. The last time I was there, the best she could do was "Muck." My Frontier flight was not very cooperative on the return trip. At first it was delayed an hour, then another hour, then another hour, then finally cancelled. I had to scramble to get a flight on Southwest Airlines with a four hour layover in Baltimore. I was supposed to get home at noon; instead, I arrived at 10:00 PM and was leaving the next morning at 4:00 AM for the Southwest. It was a busy evening.

As much as I have been to the Southwest before, this was a spectacular trip. We flew into Phoenix and ended in Vegas, which is always a hoot. We visited some of the lesser known sights like Saguaro Lake, Canyon de Chelly and Horseshoe Bend. We arrived in the late afternoon at some viewpoints which overlook the painted desert in Petrified Forest National Park. The setting sun created brilliant colors. In many ways it was a picture-perfect adventure. We almost missed one of our tours because I did not realize the Navajo Nation does not recognize Daylight Savings Time, so we suddenly lost an hour. We had one afternoon of extreme heat. But most of the time we were in higher elevations where the weather was quite pleasant. I always find my visits to that corner of the world to be uplifting and inspiring, and this time did not disappoint.

Wednesday, September 14, is the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This is the feast day for our parish. Next weekend we will acknowledge this celebration at our liturgies. In particular, the 5:00 and 11:30 Masses will include some special aspects. When you arrive for Mass, we ask that you gather in the courtyard. There will be chairs placed outside for those who need to sit. We will not prohibit anyone from entering the Worship Area. There will be a special Call to Worship as well as a procession for all that will begin in the courtyard. We invite you to be part of this procession. In addition, the offertory and setting of the altar will be emphasized. These two Masses will be a bit longer than usual.

Monday is a painful anniversary for our Nation. We all remember where we were as those tragic events unfolded. We continue to pray for those who carry the scars and burdens of all that happened that day. We pray for a spirit of wisdom to touch the Nation to make us a stronger and more united people.
