THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

"Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim, till all the world adore his sacred name." This is the refrain from an old hymn. In fact, this was the opening song used on the day of my ordination. It is an upbeat and triumphant hymn. The song reflects the paradox of the cross itself. First thoughts associated with the image of the cross could be the sadness and pain of what Christ endured. But ironically, the cross has become for us a sign of hope and strength. This day has a different emphasis than Easter. On Easter we focus on the Risen Lord. On this day, we focus on the cross itself and the power and life that comes from it.

There are several different historical moments that are connected to this feast day. First it is a recognition of our belief that St. Helena found the true cross in the fourth century. It is also a remembrance of the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre built over the tomb of Jesus. These feast days were initially celebrated by the Eastern Church but then adopted by the Roman Church in the seventh century.

For ourselves, it gives pause for us to reflect upon that mystery and wonder of the cross as it has unfolded in our lives. Your very presence at Mass is witness of your openness and trust in the cross. You may still struggle deeply with a loss or trial in your life. But something from within urges you not to give into despair but to trust in the power of the Risen Christ to bring peace to your heart. For many, the unique cross over our altar is a source of comfort and hope as the Risen Lord reaches out to us. We are a people who continually open ourselves to the cross and the wondrous way it draws us more deeply into the love of our Lord.

One reality we cannot overlook is that the cross is an experience that touches all our hearts; there is no escaping it, it is universal. Last weekend we invited you to write the name of a loved one or a prayer intention on a large white cloth. I'm sure virtually every intention written in someway reflects someone who has gone through or is in the midst of the Paschal Mystery: that is, Christ's dying and rising. This week that cloth has become our altar cloth. It is upon the litany of your intentions that we offer the sacrifice of the Mass. As the cross unites us in suffering and our hope of resurrection, so too does the altar unite us in the one meal that makes us one. We are united with one another, and we are united with the Lord.

As we celebrate the feast of our parish, may we be reminded of the precious gift we share in. This is a community where our hearts find comfort. This is a place where the power of God comes to life. "Lift high the cross," and know that our Lord is with us.

LITURGY BYTES

Happy Feast Day!

Each year the Church celebrates the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross on September 14th which also is our parish's feast day. This year we are celebrating the feast this weekend. How much do you know about this feast? It goes way back in time to the end of the 7th century when it was celebrated in Rome.

The feast commemorates the recovery of the Holy Cross which had been placed on Calvary by St. Helena and preserved in Jerusalem until it fell into the hands of the Persians. This precious relic was recovered and returned to Jerusalem by Emperor Heralius.

This day is also known as the Triumph of the Cross, the Elevation of the Cross, Holy Cross Day and Holy Rood Day. The Church celebrates the triumph of the Cross, the instrument of our redemption each year. To follow Christ, we must take up His cross and follow Him all of our earthly lives.

We make the Sign of the Cross before prayer which helps us to fix our minds and hearts to God. During trials and temptations our strength and protection is the Sign of the Cross. At baptism, we are sealed with the Sign of the Cross, signifying the fullness of redemption and that we belong to Christ.

May we look to the Cross frequently and realize that when we make the Sign of the Cross, we give our entire selves to God—mind, soul, heart, body, will and thoughts! Let us remember the symbolism and meaning every time we make the Sign of the Cross.






