

# **THINGS ARE A-POPPIN'**

Once Labor Day passes, not only does the academic world rock back to life, but the same is true in the parish. The activity level this year reflects more of the energy and activity that we experienced before Covid came into our lives.

We celebrated Confirmation on September 14<sup>th</sup>— that in and of itself was a busy and exciting day. In spite of that, there was no day off on the 15<sup>th</sup> for our Religious Ed Office. (I wish they could have taken a breath after all the hard work that was done in preparation for this happy day.) These first weeks of September are filled with parent and catechist meetings. This year our Religious Ed classes are starting a few weeks earlier than they have in the past, and so these essential meetings need to take place. The number of students in our program continues to remain strong at 862.

This year we will be offering a Family Fall Festival on Saturday, October 15<sup>th</sup>. There is a truckload of work that goes into planning an event like this. There are plans for a pumpkin patch for the kids, craft vendors, a plant sale, refreshments, and raffles. There is even a bake-off contest. We are excited to be offering a day like this. Our hope is that our families can enjoy a few hours of fun without having to empty out the wallet. We are also hoping that folks who are not part of the parish can stop by as well and have a taste of life at Holy Cross.

I'm looking forward to starting up a Men's Prayer Group beginning in October. My participation in several men's retreats many years ago was an instrumental part of my own formation. I organized a Men's Prayer Group when I was in Medford. I was also able to incorporate some of it into St. John the Baptist High School when I was chaplain. It's time for me to offer an opportunity for male spirituality here at Holy Cross.

None of these things would be possible if we did not have people who are willing to give of their time and talent. We have many parishioners who are involved, but we always need new folks to step up and share in the ministry of parish life. Some activities are a significant commitment, such as being a catechist. But there are opportunities for folks to get involved in other ways. We will be looking for lots of parishioners to help with the Family Fall Festival. Would you consider helping us out for a few hours on that day? Some of our Masses are in need of helping hands as far as being a Eucharistic Minister, Lector, or helping out with HCTV.

We are blessed with all the life and activity that is part of our parish community. We pray the Spirit will continue to lead and guide us in our efforts.

## **LITURGY BYTES**

#### RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION



We spend many hours teaching our young people who are preparing for their first Holy Communion how they should receive Jesus. From time to time, I am sure many of us have observed adults at Mass who come forward to receive displaying some different gestures and behaviors. Let us spend a little time reviewing how we should receive Our Lord at Mass.

**Procession:** Row by row we come forward to receive with our hands folded in a prayerlike way. The Communion Procession, a profoundly religious action, tells us something about the way in which we should participate in this procession. We are the Body of Christ moving forward to receive the Christ who makes us one with himself and with one another.

**Reception:** This is a slight bow of reverence as the minister or priest holds the host before you saying: "The Body of Christ." Our response is: **Amen.** We then either extend our hands to receive or open our mouth and extend our tongue. Once Our Lord has been received, we move either left or right to return to our seats. We must consume the host immediately and never hold it walking back to our seats. Once walking back to our seats, our hands should remain folded as they were when coming forward. Casually walking with swinging arms is not the correct posture.

**After Receiving:** Once we return to our seats, it is appropriate to spend a little time in prayer either sitting or kneeling (if you can). Technically, we should remain kneeling until the distribution of Communion has been completed and the remaining hosts are placed in the Tabernacle.

**What Ifs!:** If the host falls to the ground, please do not panic. The priest or other minister knows what to do. They will give you another and then take care of the one that has fallen.

Suppose you receive only a piece of the host. Is that still Jesus? Yes it is, and please do not be concerned if it should happen. Sometimes, if more people come forward and we are running low on consecrated hosts, you might receive a half of the host. Again, please do not be alarmed at this; what you receive is still Our Lord.

St. Augustine tells us as a member of the Body of Christ, our "Amen" must be true. In other words, our Amen is saying yes it is true this is Christ!

#### Attention Holy Cross Volunteers

Virtus Training, <u>Protecting God's Children for Adults</u>, will be offered at Holy Cross on:

Tuesday, October 4, 2022, 6:30 - 9:00 PM

As you know, <u>all</u> parish and diocesan employees and volunteers are required by the Diocese to attend a Virtus session. (Those who have already attended Virtus are not required to go again.) If you have not yet taken Virtus training, <u>please register on-line right</u> <u>away</u>, as the number of participants is limited to 20. You <u>must</u> be registered to attend a Virtus session.

To register, go to <u>www.virtus.org</u> and follow the directions. Complete instructions about the requirements for all parish volunteers are given on the following page.

#### For Volunteers in the Diocese of Rockville Centre

A person wishing to volunteer in any parish or organization in the Diocese of Rockville Centre must first complete three requirements:

- Attend Protecting God's Children (Virtus)
- 2. Sign the Codes of Conduct
- 3. Complete a background screening application.

(Background screening is conducted on all volunteers and employees every 5 years.)

#### **Directions to Complete the 3 Requirements:**

- 1. Sign up to attend a Protecting God's Children class: <a href="www.Virtus.org">www.Virtus.org</a> When you log on to the Virtus website, you will create a Virtus account.
  - a. If you have not attended a Virtus class, you are a first-time registrant.
  - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization from the drop down list select Rockville Centre-Safe Environment.
  - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
  - d. One screen will have the Codes of Conduct. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
  - Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
  - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
  - 2. Background Screening Application:
    - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
    - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
    - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
    - After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'






#### Press a Girl Around the World

## Fall Cash Fling

For many years the Cash Calendar was a part of the Holy Cross routine. This fundraiser provided some additional financial support to the parish. In addition, many parishioners enjoyed participating in it. Unfortunately, it was one of the many parts of parish life that was lost to COVID. At this time, it is unlikely that we have enough parishioners attending Mass on a weekly basis to support a monthly drawing, and so, we present the "Fall Cash Fling." This is a similar idea, however it is offered on a quarterly basis.
