A BIT OF HISTORY

Our building is a symbol of what our parish is all about. It is meant to be a place of warmth and welcome, a place where people on the journey of faith can find a home, a place where that faith can be both nurtured and challenged, a place where our relationship with Christ can be deepened through the sacraments and through our contacts and fellowship with one another.

The experience of the Worship Center is meant to begin as one turns off Nichols Road. The entrance driveway brings you into the trees that speak of the beauty of God's creation and up the hill on the top of which stands our Parish home where we come for nourishment and peace.

Virtually all of the sculptures that adorn our Church were crafted by the hands of Father Harold Buckley. But, it was more than just Fr. Buckley's hands that created these masterpieces, it was his heart, his soul and above all his understanding of just what the Parish of the Holy Cross is and what it would be for generations to come.



The Welcoming Christ

As you enter the outdoor atrium, you are greeted by the statue of the Welcoming Christ. This piece which was created and sculpted by Fr. Buckley captures part of the essence of our parish spirit. Fr. Buckley writes of this statue:

“We greet you in the name and out of the energy of Jesus Christ. The WHOLE community of this building, dedicated to his Holy Cross, want you to know the same welcome the children knew when he blessed them; or the disciples felt when he fed them in the fields; or the warmth the couple and their guests at Cana experienced because Jesus and his Mother were there ... The first and most obvious thing is the gesture: clearly it should be one of welcome... of offering this building for your stay, your use, your comfort, your peace - in

a word for the nourishment of your body and soul ... On a tray beside Him we see the bread sliced and ready to feed the many levels of our life; the grapes, some whole for simple joys, and some already wine, crushed and pressed for greater celebrations. ALL these happen in this building.”

As you enter the front door, you can glance down the ambulatory at the tabernacle which is positioned between the daily chapel and the main Worship Area. As you proceed forward, you come into a large open space which is the inner atrium.

Our parishioners enjoy gathering before and after liturgy to “catch up” with friends and neighbors and to experience the fellowship which is celebrated sacramentally inside. The skylights above this area are meant to give the message: Welcome into God’s house; this is where we meet Jesus the Light. This large area is also used for many different groups during the week.

As you enter the Worship Area, the first thing you come upon is the Baptismal Font with the flowing waters which signify the “living water” that Christ offers to all of us. Baptism is our “door” into God’s family. Every time we come to Christ in the Eucharist, we come through Baptism. We bless ourselves with this baptismal water and mark ourselves anew with the sign in which we were baptized - the sign of the cross.

Standing by the baptismal font is the Paschal Candle which reminds us that we are invited to share in the light of Christ which shone on Easter morning. The prayer of the Easter Vigil captures the meaning of the Paschal candle: “May all who are buried with Christ in the Death of Baptism rise also with Him to the newness of life.” This prayer takes on special meaning at funerals when the baptismal water is sprinkled on the casket at the door of the Church.

The baptismal font is at the base of one of the columns which supports the roof. On the front of this column is the ambry which is a small chest containing sacred oils blessed by the Bishop on Holy Thursday. The oil of the Catechumens and the sacred chrism are used in Baptism and Confirmation; the oil of the sick is used to offer the healing of Jesus to the bodies and spirits of those who are suffering from illness.

As you look upward you see that the roof of the Worship Area stands on four columns in the form of a cross. The columns are shaped in tree-like patterns to echo the beautiful trees outside which are visible through the glass behind the main altar and also on the sides of the Worship Area. The tree-like columns are also meant to remind us of the “tree of the cross” on which Jesus gave His life for us and in so doing invited us to give our lives as gifts to others. The cross of Jesus after which our parish is named is truly the “Tree of Life.”

The crucifix over the main altar was sculpted by Fr. Buckley and it symbolizes the heart of our Christian faith. It is a reminder of both Good Friday and Easter morning. The cross itself is clear acrylic to allow the light to pass through it as a reminder that the wood of the cross has been transformed by the light of the Resurrection. The

figure of Christ is rising. Jesus is gesturing with one hand toward the Father and with the other hand he gestures toward the Eucharist and the people who celebrate the Eucharist by living His death and Resurrection everyday.

The white marble altar along with the marble ambo (pulpit) and marble lectern are the signs of our worship. Here we proclaim the Word of the Lord. Here we remember and celebrate his life-giving death and glorious Resurrection in the ancient symbols of bread and wine. Here the community gathers to be empowered to bring the joy and peace of His Resurrection out to the world.

Our connection to the Lord's cross and Resurrection is symbolized by a stone from the area of Calvary in the Holy Land. It is encased in a diamond-like pyramid which is beneath the main altar. The stone gives us a symbolic link to the events in the life of our Lord out of which the Church was born.

To the right of the main Worship Area is the daily Chapel. The altar, designed and constructed as a work of love by one of our parishioners is made of inlaid wood and reflects the beauty of God's creation which is visible just behind the altar. The Chapel is named *The Chapel of the Discipleship of the Blessed Virgin Mary*. When originally built, the chapel was simply referred to as "the daily Mass Chapel." Soon thereafter, the parishioners thought that it would be fitting to honor Mary and dedicate the chapel to her.

Fr. Buckley's most recent contribution to Holy Cross is the three panels which adorn the far wall of the chapel, each reminding us of an important event in the life of the Blessed Mother and of her discipleship of love, faith and trust in God. The sculptures are *The Visitation*, *Pentecost*, and *The Wedding at Cana*.



The Visitation

The Visitation (Luke 1:39-55) - In the foreground, Mary is seen meeting with her cousin Elizabeth who is six months with her child, St. John the Baptist. In the distance is a portrayal of the Angel Gabriel coming to Mary as he said the words "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee."

Pentecost

Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4) - Fr. Buckley's depiction of the birthday of the Church shows Mary and the other disciples receiving the gifts of the Holy Spirit, enabling them to go out and continue the mission of Jesus. "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit."



The Wedding at Cana

The Wedding at Cana (John 2:1-12) - This sculpture depicts Mary instructing the waiters to "Do as He tells you" after which Jesus, although questioning His mother's purpose, transformed six large urns of water into the finest wine served at the wedding feast.

Throughout this series of chapel sculptures, Fr. Buckley reminds us of Mary's faith and trust in the Son of God and her discipleship, even at times when that faith must have truly been tested. The serenity found in our chapel, brings that same faith to those who visit.

Standing between the chapel and the main Worship Area is the tabernacle. This piece by Fr. Buckley uses the story of the Risen Christ on the road to Emmaus as its theme. It is also made of clear acrylic. We are reminded that just as the disciples, we recognize Him in one another especially when we gather for the breaking of bread. The sanctuary lamp which is near the tabernacle is made up of the figures of many angels who signify the divine presence, and the lamp shines with light to remind us of the "bread of angels" which is always present for our communal and personal prayer.

May our loving Lord continue to guide us, may we always remember how much we have been given, and may the Spirit inspire us to know how we can truly share the blessings of this house of God with others.
