Traditionally, the third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. It is meant to be a day of joy in the midst of this holy season of Advent. Waiting need not be a difficult experience. In fact, when it is done with purpose it enhances the experience. Immediate gratification is not always the best path. I remember as a young child, the excitement and anticipation of Christmas were almost better than the day itself. This joyful waiting can be part of our spiritual journey as well. Although these days can be busy and hectic, I pray you find the ability to seek and celebrate joy in your life.

This Thursday Holy Cross looked like Santa's North Pole Annex. We distributed all of the items that were purchased as well as the many gift cards that were donated. In addition to our own program, we were also able to share some of our gifts with other organizations that are in need during these weeks. Many thanks to all of you who once again made this program a great success. Because of your generosity, over 60 families received gifts. Over \$10,000 worth of gift cards were given. Thank you also to our Parish Outreach Office and volunteers. Between the Thanksgiving Basket Program and the Christmas Angel Program, these become very busy days. 
