

# Happy St. Patrick's Day (and St. Joseph's on Tuesday)

This week I will be spending a few evenings out of the parish. Once a year I offer a Parish Mission with three of my priest friends. Some of you may remember that our little group came to Holy Cross to offer that Mission. I believe that was in 2005. (I remember thinking to myself when I came here, "This is a really neat parish.") This week we are offering our program to Curé of Ars Parish in Merrick.

This Mission began back in 1996. We were all friends of a priest who some of you may have known, Msgr. Fred Schaffer. He had been diagnosed with cancer and was undergoing treatments. He was in a single-priest parish, and the four of us offered our help if he needed any weddings or Masses covered. He said he would like our help, but not in assisting with any of the Sacraments. He said to the four of us, "I would like you to come up with a Lenten Mission you can offer the parish." Although we had no experience in offering a Mission, we came up with a theme and our talks, and we did our first Parish Mission in Lent of 1996.

As time went on, other parishes heard about our offering and invited us. At one point we were doing three a year. This is going to be the final time we offer the Mission. It was a good thing, and it had a good run. But, there is a time and season for everything. It was a good opportunity for the four of us to work together. We know each other as friends for what seems like forever. And, we don't always have an opportunity to minister together as priests.

This week there is a farewell party for priests to say good-bye to Bishop Robert Brennan. Bishop Brennan has been one of our Auxiliary Bishops here in the Diocese since 2012. He has also served in the capacity of Vicar General, which is kind of like being a "co-pilot." He has a great pastoral sense and a good sense of humor. He has served the Church well throughout his years of ministry here on Long Island, and he will be missed. He was named Ordinary of the Diocese of Columbus, Ohio. That assignment begins at the end of March.

Is it me or have prices at the supermarket gone crazy the last few weeks? Yikes, a small head of cauliflower at Meat Farms was \$6. I don't know why there would have been such a spike in prices, but it is unsettling. For some folks, they are able to go with the flow with these kinds of fluctuations. But for others, it puts a strain on the food budget, and it can become a source of worry.

Happy St. Patrick's Day to all who are Irish. My national heritage is Hungarian and German, so this is not the biggest day of the year for me. But, I do enjoy a nice corned beef and cabbage dinner. And, Happy St. Joseph's Day. I love the St. Joseph's pastry.

Lent offers us a unique period of time to evaluate our life journey as a follower of Christ. We are encouraged to assess if this journey has led us to an improved understanding and deepening of our relationship with our Lord, with our neighbors, and with our brothers and sisters of the world community.

For the last 28 years we at Holy Cross have embraced our Lenten Project, **Eat Simply So Others May Simply Eat**, as a way to raise our consciousness to the significant needs of our struggling friends. We willingly sacrifice larger or better meals for simpler meals during Lent. Our joint effort to **EAT MORE SIMPLY SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT** unites us in a special way with one another and also with those who are struggling on Long Island.



We encourage you not only to participate in this program, but also to discuss it at the dinner table with your children and family members. Many of us are not consciously aware of the number of people that are struggling and hungry right here in our own area. During 2018, our Outreach pantry served over 100 people each month.

The Lenten envelopes marked, **EAT SIMPLY...SO OTHERS MAY SIMPLY EAT,** will be available throughout the weekends of Lent. We suggest that you place the envelope in a prominent place in your kitchen as a reminder of how you and your family will be uniting yourselves with our struggling neighbors and with the starving of the world. We encourage you to reflect, discuss and to decide how you will eat more basic meals during Lent. Perhaps you have a favorite simple recipe to share. We'd be happy to put it in the bulletin for fellow parishioners to try.

Each weekend or whenever you choose during Lent, you may place your envelope in the basket on the pillar by the Altar or in the collection basket. The monies donated will be used to help those who come to Parish Outreach for assistance. We are continually grateful for the very generous response of our parishioners of Holy Cross in donating money, food and supermarket gift cards, which enables us to meet their needs.




# **SACRED SILENCE**

### **RELIGIOUS FREEDOM**



**Anti-Semitism Increasing** In America & Europe

Jews make up only 2% of the U.S. population but in 2017, according to the Anti-Defamation League, they faced more physical attacks than all other religions combined. In October 2018, the deadliest attack on a Jewish community in the history of the U.S. was in Pittsburgh when a gunman killed 11 worshipers in a synagogue.

In Europe, France has reported a 74% increase in offenses and, in Germany, the number of violent anti-semitic attacks surged by more than 60%. The UK, Belgium, Sweden and the Netherlands also saw increases in incidents.

Holocaust Remembrance Day, January 27th, was established by the United Nations in 2005 to promote Holocaust education and is the date of the liberation of the Auschwitz concentration camp.

This year, on January 27<sup>th</sup>, the White House issued a statement, "Six million Jews were systematically slaughtered in horrific ways. The brutality of the Holocaust was a crime against men, women, and children. It was a crime against humanity. It was a crime against God."

Sadly, recent surveys show many adults lack basic knowledge about the genocide. 41% of Americans, 66% of millennials (ages 23-38), don't know what Auschwitz was. 22% of millennials said they had never heard of the Holocaust.
