This past week we celebrated Administrative Professionals' Day. We had a special luncheon on Tuesday for our honorees. Holy Cross is blessed to have three individuals who do tremendous work in our Parish Office. Jane Wirth is in the main office and receives many phone calls and visitors as well as produces our weekly bulletin. Mary Pannone works on the many details of keeping our Religious Education Office working efficiently. Barbara Shipman works part-time in helping to keep my desk clean and my life organized. These women are capable in the tasks that are part of their respective jobs. But beyond that, they have a sense of ministry and service to the entire parish community. We are pleased to announce that Holy Cross will be participating in something called "Formed." A simple way to describe Formed is that it is a Catholic Netflix. Once we join, all parishioners will be given the information and password to access a host of Catholic resources on their computers. Formed is a collection of talks, classes, movies and programming which is consistent with Catholic teaching. It offers a well organized website that directs members to whatever they are looking for: scripture reflection, the lives of saints, family programming, materials for children, etc. Normally, a subscription costs a parish \$1,750 a year. However, a benefactor has made a donation to the Diocese which lowers the cost to only \$600. There are many parishes throughout Long Island that will take advantage of this opportunity. More information will be forthcoming in the next few weeks. We hope that many parishioners will use this valuable resource.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2018-2019 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register**. If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 15, 2018.
- Office Hours: Monday – Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials will be sent to your home early in May and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 15, 2018.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.

The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

She is a dynamic and compelling speaker at over 250 venues each year who travels across the country discussing the roots of our constitutional liberties, including the fight for Liberty and for Religious Freedom.

Born and raised in St. Louis, MO, KrisAnne received her undergraduate degree in Biochemistry from Blackburn College and her J.D. from the University of Florida, Levin College of Law. She is a former Russian Linguist for the U.S. Army. She has worked as a state prosecutor in Florida and has spent two years with a prominent law firm, defending religious liberty and first amendment rights.

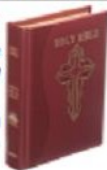
