30th Anniversary Thoughts

by Father Michael

This week my classmates and I celebrate thirty years of priestly ministry. Our actual anniversary date is June 4. It was Bishop McGann who ordained us at St. Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre in 1988. My first Mass was the feast of Corpus Christi (the Body and Blood of our Lord), which happens to be the feast for this weekend. It is a happy coincidence, but nonetheless a beautiful way to celebrate this milestone occasion.

It was a long and winding road to get to my ordination day. After college, the seminary program was five years long. There were lots of courses I needed to pass. For one who was never a great student, this was a bit of a challenge. Beyond the academics, I had to demonstrate that I was balanced in my spirituality, able to integrate academics with pastoral settings, able to work with others, etc. I suppose in the back of my mind when I finally reached ordination day, I thought I had learned everything I needed to be a priest; I was ready to go. Yes, I did learn a lot, and yes, in some ways I was prepared. But on another level, my ordination day was only the beginning.

It is remarkable how much my priesthood has taken on meaning because of the people I encountered through the years. The parishioners at St. Elizabeth Parish in Melville had to be patient with me as I slowly learned all “my firsts” in that community. Certainly, the young people I met at St. John the Baptist High School provided me an education in many ways for the seven years I was chaplain there. And even now, after 30 years I continue to be formed and understand more deeply the ways in which I have been called to be a priest, servant, and pastor.

Preaching will always be my first love. But, there are so many other occasions that are moments of grace. Happy times and difficult moments are all opportunities to encounter the Lord. And, I even get to be a part-time tour guide as I lead the parish on different trips to fun places. Priesthood has its challenges, but it is also a gift beyond measure.

The nature of Diocesan priesthood is unique. While there is a bit of a discernment process, the assignment of priests to a particular parish is always going to be a combination of the Bishop’s choice and the work of the Holy Spirit. It is remarkable how beautifully it has always worked out (at least from my perspective, and I hope from yours as well). I feel blessed to be here, and I cherish these years of ministry I share with you.

30th Anniversary celebrations continue next weekend. The Parish Picnic takes place at the Nesconset Gazebo by the library on Smithtown Blvd. Remember to bring a blanket and a chair. I’m sure it will be a great day for the parish. I hope you can be there.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Welcome to Holy Cross Religious Education

The Religious Education Office is planning ahead to the 2018-2019 Formation Year. We need your help so that we can adequately plan to meet the needs of our parish. If you have a child entering **First Grade in September you need to register**. If you have recently moved to our parish you need to register in the parish. Our program is "home based." Classes do not take place at the Church; rather they are held in the homes of our Catechists. Because of this, there are geographical limits on who we are able to accommodate. Please contact our office for more specific information.

- First time registration needs to be done in person at our office.
- Registration needs to be completed by June 15, 2018.
- Office Hours: Monday – Friday 9:00-12:00 & 1:00-4:00
- If your child was not baptized at Holy Cross you need to bring a copy of your child's Baptism Certificate.
- For those who are already part of our program, you need to re-register for the upcoming year. Materials have been sent to your home early in May and they may be returned by mail. Please note the deadline of June 15, 2018.

A detailed outline of our program is available on-line or at our office. But, there are a few important details to be noted.

- Children must successfully complete each grade level to proceed to the next.
- The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation require a minimum of two years of preparation.

Most importantly, we need to work together. Faithful attendance at classes and parent workshops is essential. As comprehensive and informative as our program is, this is only one part of your child's faith formation. The greatest thing you can do to nurture your faith and the faith of your child is to regularly be part of our Sunday Eucharist.



The Catechism of the Church states that parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. We are privileged to work with you in this task. We thank you for your cooperation in allowing us to be part of your lives. We look forward to a fruitful year where everyone, young and old, continues to grow in understanding the gift of our faith.

Parish Outreach sends cards, on behalf of our parish, to those who are ill or hospitalized. Our homebound folks receive friendly telephone calls by Outreach volunteers to keep up the connection and to assess ways the parish can be present to these loved parishioners. At Advent and Easter time a volunteer will visit them and bring a gift from the parish community. Eucharistic Ministers are also available to bring communion to the homebound who desire it.

**Graduation Speakers

Colorado Mesa University has reversed its requirement that graduation speeches must be devoid of religious references after Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) contacted them on behalf of a student who was told she needed to keep comments about Christ out of her planned speech. University officials had told the graduate to “take out the last section where you state that you find comfort in Jesus’ words and cite a Bible verse.”

Wrote an ADF attorney: “It is well established law (U.S. Supreme Court) that university officials cannot silence speech simply because it expresses a particular viewpoint, including a religious one. When the school’s officials were confronted with what the law required, they quickly backtracked and allowed the student to speak freely.”

“I share the concern and frustration that many Americans feel about situations where the protections accorded by the First Amendment are not recognized or understood. This problem has manifested itself in our nation’s public schools.”

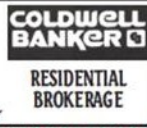

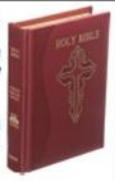
