

Highlights of Quarter:

- Collections are down approximately \$11,000 this quarter compared to this time last year.
- Our Easter collection was down \$1,361. from last year's Easter collection.
- Diocesan Non School Assessment and Diocesan Assessment increased this quarter which brought our surplus down by approx. \$8,000.
- Total building maintenance expenses were lower this year than last because of the lack of snow removal needed this winter season.
- We have just installed a new sprinkler system in our front courtyard, and have replaced our phone system throughout the church office.
- We look forward to installing automated handicapped doors at the atrium entrance. When completed, cost should total less than \$10,000.
- Parish Program income is up this quarter due to Religious Ed. and VBS registration.
