Summer - A Time to Spruce Things Up

Two repair projects have taken place this week. First, the skylights in the Atrium have been replaced. They were originally installed when the building was first built. They hung in there for 23 years, but they finally wore out. The perimeter of each skylight was riddled with tiny cracks. Sooner or later this would have become a safety issue. Hopefully, this will resolve the leaks that surround the skylights. The second project completed is that the parish house now has new gutters and downspouts. The ones we had were always a bit undersized for the size of the house. There were not enough downspouts, and an incorrect pitch created cascading water directly over the front door in heavy rain. The cost for both of these repairs was funded by our special Renovations and Major Repairs account. Thank you to all who regularly use that orange envelope. Your donations give us the funds we need to maintain and repair our facilities.

One more repair that we are trying to complete is the timer for the parking lot lights. The original timer was a big, old motorized unit that sputtered to a stop at the end of May. We are replacing it with a smaller and more versatile electronic unit. It took some time to find the right timer and for it to be installed correctly. Happily, it broke during the months when the hours of daylight are the longest and there are not many evening activities.

There are a few little projects keeping me busy at the house. Every year I have to prune back the branches and shrubbery that grow along the driveway. Mother Nature keeps wanting to claim back the driveway for herself. So, each summer I need to push back the overgrowth to keep the driveway clear. I also like chopping firewood. I don't use a lot each winter, but enough that I need to create a small woodpile. I put on my lumberjack outfit and slowly split my way through a pile of cut logs.

I also use these days to try to catch up on a little reading. So far I have only made it through one short James Martin book, but I am optimistic the pile of things I want to read will grow shorter. I enjoy sitting outside in the early evening while the sun goes down. I spend about half the time enjoying the sunset and the other half plowing through a few pages. If I am really inspired, I throw a few pieces of wood into my little fire pit, bring out a lamp, and read into the evening. (Another reason for me to head back to the woodpile and do a little more work.)

I hope these days of summer afford you the opportunity to catch up on your own little projects as well as find a bit of time for relaxation and fun. Enjoy.

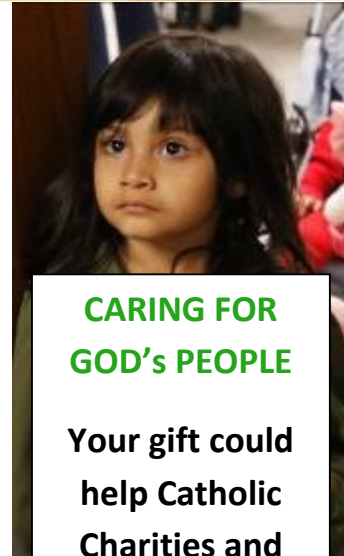

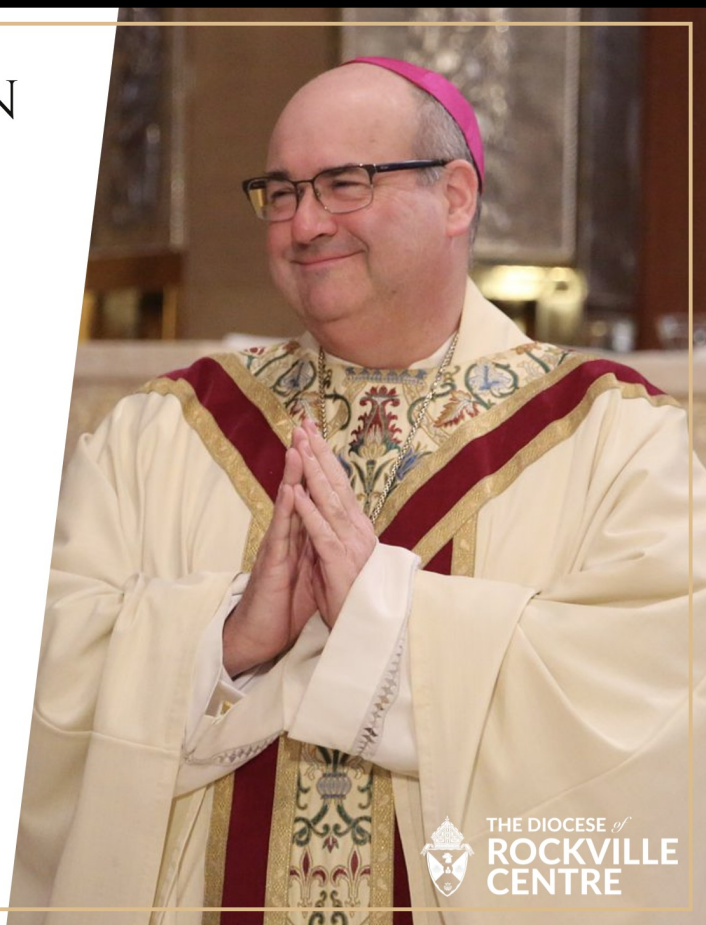

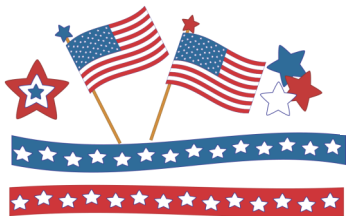

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



Threats to Free Speech

In the U.S., free speech has been *narrowly* upheld by a Supreme Court 5-4 decision in favor of pro-life pregnancy centers by holding that a 2015 California law requiring these centers to promote abortion clinics alongside their pro-life services violates the First Amendment.

“Advertising or promoting abortion runs directly counter to the very reason pregnancy centers exist – namely to enable and support women who want to choose life for their children. The government has no business forcing these centers to violate their First Amendment right to freedom of speech and, in doing so, work against their life-affirming mission,” said the president of the Family Research Council.

Justice Anthony Kennedy said the First Amendment bars compelling people to betray their beliefs. He wrote, “Governments must not be allowed to force persons to express a message contrary to their deepest convictions. Freedom of Speech secures freedom of thought and belief. This 2015 law imperils those liberties.”

IN POLAND, under a new and controversial “Holocaust” law, it is now a crime for anyone to question the official nationalist narrative that Poles were solely “victims” of historical events and not complicit in the Nazi crimes in the concentration camps in Poland. Peaceful protestors, historians, teachers, journalists, or anyone else expressing opposition to historical revisionism, are targeted by the police.
