## Just a Reminder: Life Can Be Hard

Last weekend I preached about how the recent Gospel readings have been challenging. They remind us that the call to discipleship often demands discipline, sacrifice and commitment. Related to that theme, there are two powerful Church celebrations that take place at the end of the week. First, Saturday is the Exaltation of the Cross. (This is the informal feast day for our parish.) This is followed by September 15, which this year falls on a Sunday. If it was any other day of the week, we would celebrate our Lady of Sorrows. The Church connects these two days that speak both of the power of the Paschal Mystery and the compassion of our Lady. We are reminded that life can be hard.

We don't have to look very far to identify crosses that are being lived out in so many circumstances. Beyond our own lives, we need to be mindful of the suffering of others. The people of the Bahamas are trying to rebuild their lives after so many of their homes were destroyed by Hurricane Dorian. There continues to be suffering surrounding the complicated issues of immigration that our nation faces. Victims of abuse, even those hurt by the Church, continue to grapple with pain and brokenness within their lives. This past week our nation remembered the terror attacks of 2001. There are countless situations that place individuals in the midst of hardship and suffering. We need to acknowledge that pain. If a particular issue does not hit close to home, there can be a temptation to forget or minimize the suffering that many people endure. But, the truth remains - life can be hard.

Both of these special days serve to remind us of the hardship and suffering that can be part of the human experience, but they are not meant to be days of dread or despair. In each instance, the Church emphasizes the light rather than the darkness of the cross. The emphasis on September 14 is the triumph of the cross. We believe the power of God's love is stronger even than death. We look to the cross as a sign of hope.

Traditionally, on September 15 Our Lady of Sorrows is celebrated. Throughout the Gospels there are stories of suffering such as Jesus' parents fleeing to Egypt, and Mary standing at the foot of the cross. We believe our Blessed Mother is present in those moments of suffering; her heart was pierced by the suffering of her Son. Yet, she is able to bring the compassion and mercy that comes from a mother's heart. She was present to the suffering that surrounded the life of her Son, and she is present to our own brokenness.

Yes, life can be tough. But, as tough as it is, the power and strength of the Risen Christ will always empower us to move forward with courage and faith.

## Liturgy Bytes



Thought for the Week: Congregation, Assembly, the People of God, the Body of Christ – wear it well!

I am sure you can guess what this week's "byte" is about from the thought for the week. It is about US – you and me! Do you believe we are all those terms mentioned above? They sound important, don't they? They all play an important role in the celebration of the Mass. I hope to reflect a little on our role as part of the congregation today.

By virtue of our Baptism, we are joined to the divine action of the Mass, which incorporates us into the risen Christ. This action, which lies at the center of the whole Christian life is not initiated by us but by God acting in and through the Church as the body of the risen Christ. It becomes our action only to the extent that we give ourselves to this mystery of redemptive worship.

THE LITURGY IS DESIGNED TO BRING ABOUT IN ALL THOSE WHO MAKE UP THE WORSHIPPING ASSEMBLY (us) A PARTICIPATION OF THE FAITHFUL BOTH IN BODY AND MIND, A PARTICIPATION BURNING WITH FAITH, HOPE AND CHARITY. To the extent that we are able to participate in this way, the work of redemption becomes personally effective for each of us. By such participation, we make the actions and prayers of the liturgy our own; we enter more fully into our personal communion with Christ's redeeming act and perfect worship.

Keep in mind, that in the celebration of Mass, the faithful are a holy people, a chosen people, a royal priesthood! Through our deep sense of reverence for God and our charity to our sisters and brothers who share in the celebration, we give thanks, offer Jesus through and together with the priest. Through this we become ONE BODY.

The CCC tells us that there are certain parts of the Mass that are to be done by the whole assembly (us), in order to express the corporate nature of this act. Through these actions, the entire congregation of the faithful joins itself to Christ in acknowledging the great things that God has done and in offering the sacrifice.

So our prayers, our reverence joined with those around us are needed for the celebration of Mass each Lord's Day. Embrace this experience with your whole heart, your whole soul and with your whole mind, so to make Mass the centerpiece of your day. Look for part 2 about our role in the Mass next week! 


