American Lutheran Church February Council Meeting February 9, 2023

President Sue Hoey called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm both in person and electronically on Zoom. Present were Sue Hoey, Shirley Bergman, Beth Stanek, Cindy Gosse, Barb Hayek, and Christy Phillips. Joining on Zoom were Mitchell Hayek and Sheila Collins.

Sue led devotions from Hebrews 6:19 and concluded with prayer.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The checking account balance at the end of January was \$10,849.28. Barb Hayek made a motion to transfer \$849.28 to the General Savings and Emergency Fund. Second by Christy Phillips. Motion carried. Sheila Collins made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried. Cindy Gosse will find out if we are allowed to earn growth on the General Savings and Emergency Fund

<u>Secretary's Report</u> – Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 9, 2023 council meeting. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

<u>Abundant Life</u> – There has been no activity by this committee in the past year. Mitchell Hayek made a motion to dissolve the Abundant Life Committee. Second by Beth Stanek. Motion carried.

<u>Hospitality</u> – The Committee is coordinating the ecumenical Ash Wednesday soup supper and other Lenten soup suppers at ALC.

Presidents – Brad Jesse is the new council president at ZLC.

<u>Property</u> – Church: The church temperature is set at 60 degrees during the week and 68 degrees on Sunday through the winter. A contractor has been contacted to fix the seal on the front Narthex door.

Parsonage: The seal on the bottom of the front door will be replaced. Shirley Bergman continues to monitor the empty parsonage.

<u>Scholarship</u> – No report.

Technology – No report.

<u>Worship and Music</u> – Hymns have been chosen up to Easter. The designated offering for the Ash Wednesday ecumenical service will be split between the Jesup Ministerial Alliance and the Independence Area Food Pantry. Cindy Gosse made a motion to designate the offerings from the other two Lenten services at ALC to go to the Food Pantry. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

The possibility of having a musical youth performance and a breakfast on Easter Sunday was discussed.

Confirmation classes finish the end of April. A confirmation date needs to be determined.

Youth – An outing has been planned for March 24 to attend a Waterloo Black Hawks hockey game.

<u>Call Committee</u> – The committee met to compare survey results from both congregations and compose a draft of the ministry site profile.

<u>Election of Officers for 2023 Council -</u> Barb Hayek made a motion to nominate Christy Phillips for President and Beth Stanek for Vice President. Both agreed to be nominated. Motion seconded by Cindy Gosse. Motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

Parsonage Vacancy – Dr. Merritt Jones joined the meeting to present information on having the parsonage occupied during the call process. The minutes of the October 2022 council meeting state that this decision would be put on hold until a request for occupancy was received. Council was made aware at tonight's meeting that two related members of ZLC are in need of temporary housing. Some pros (income and ministry opportunity) and cons (property tax issues, insurance questions, property risks) were discussed. Cindy Gosse made a motion to not allow occupancy of the parsonage at this time. Second by Beth Stanek. Before a vote could be taken Mitchell Hayek made a motion to table this decision until all council members have had a chance to review Dr. Jones' information and have more questions answered. Second by Barb Hayek. Motion carried.

Worship time change – It has been suggested that changing worship times from 8:30 am and 10:00 am to 9:00 am and 10:30 am may be beneficial to attendance. We could address this topic at the joint council meeting with ZLC in the spring.

New Council installation will be March 5, 2023.

Call Committee Update:

For the last several months the call committee has been collecting data about our congregation and community as part of the process of completing a ministerial survey that will be presented to the synod. The committee consists of Amanda Phillips, chair, Chris Waring, Bill Schneider, and Merritt Jones. We have met with the call committee from Jubilee and will be seeking a pastor to serve both congregations. Both congregations have similar demographics and face the similar challenges, so hopefully we will not have difficulty finding a pastor who will be a good fit for both.

The results of our congregational survey showed no real surprises. The survey indicated that the majority of the congregation sees our greatest needs as someone who's strengths include conducting a good worship service, building a sense of unity within the congregation, will work well with the youth, and is committed to Christian education. I haven't seen Jubilee's survey, but I imagine it is not greatly different.

The processes going forward will be to present our findings to a representative of the Bishop to discuss our findings and needs. They will then go to work finding a candidate who comes close to meeting our needs. This is likely to be a slow process. There are 40 empty pulpits in the NE lowa Synod. We hope that we will be able to call a pastor who will provide leadership that will instill new energy into our congregational family and lead us to grow the activities that bring us together as a body of Christ.
