#### **Back to School Month**

Saying goodbye to summer and transitioning into a new school year can be a difficult time for many adolescents, especially those with emotional or behavioral disorders.

LSI has 27 therapists that provide mental health counseling to individuals of all ages through inperson therapy in over 20 locations across the state and virtual therapy in all 99 counties. In 2022, our Clinical Services team served more than 1,000 clients, totaling 14,000+ therapy sessions for lowans of all ages.

In addition, our Behavioral Health Intervention Services team wraps care around a child's entire family to empower them with skills like anger management, healthy decision-making and problem-solving. In 2022, the BHIS team served over 250 clients, resulting in more than 3,900 therapy sessions for children and their families.

Through LSI's Trauma Informed Care program at the Juvenile Detention Center in Waterloo, our staff work with the teens by completing trauma assessments on each adolescent and providing a summary to their juvenile court officers. The LSI staff also facilitate both individual and group therapy sessions with the teens to help them deal with their trauma and work through it in a productive way.

#### American Lutheran Church May Council Meeting May 8, 2023

President Christy Phillips called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm both in person and electronically on Zoom. Present were Christy Phillips, Beth Stanek, Cindy Gosse, Shirley Bergman, Barb Hayek, and Sue Hoey. Joining on Zoom were Mitchell Hayek and Sheila Collins.

Christy Phillips led devotions.

Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the agenda with the amendment of adding lawn care and property Insurance to New Business. Second by Barb Hayek. The agenda was approved as amended.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The checking account balance at the end of April was \$9,325.18. Since the total is under \$10,000, there will not be any transfer to the General Savings and Emergency Fund. Barb Hayek made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report – Cindy Gosse made a motion to approve the minutes of both the April 3, 2023 council meeting and the April 26, 2023 joint council meeting with ZLC. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.

#### **Committee Reports**

<u>Hospitality</u> – Graduates will be honored on Sunday May 21.

Memorial – No report.

<u>Parish Ed</u> – Wednesday evening Sunday School is done for the summer. One or more new committee members are needed.

<u>Presidents</u> – No report.

Property – Parsonage: The parsonage continues to be checked on regularly. Shirley Bergman will have the committee address a bulge in the siding. Mike Mostek will mow and maintain the area between his property and the parsonage. We will ask Independence Plumbing, Heating, and Cooling, Inc. for an estimate to replace the 35-year-old furnace and air conditioner. We will look to take advantage of any energy rebates as improvements to the property are considered.

Church: The state inspection of the elevator has

been completed and concerns addressed. We are waiting for a new service agreement with Schindler Elevator Co. to arrive in the mail.

The Biennial Report for American Lutheran Church has been submitted to the Iowa Secretary of State and has been filed in the Secretary's office.

Scholarship – No report.

<u>Technology</u> – Premier Technology has replaced the Secretary's computer.

Worship and Music – A variety of percussion instruments for enhancing Sunday morning services as well as Wednesday Worship have been purchased with money from the music fund.

Youth – Beth Stanek will be in charge of the "lunch in the park" fundraiser this summer. The committee would like to plan a bonfire get together soon.

<u>Call Committee</u> – The NEIA Synod has received all

necessary documents from the Call Committee. The Committee is waiting for the Synod representative to respond to a request for a meeting.

#### **New Business**

A private baptism service will be held at noon on Sunday, May 21. Christy Phillips will be the council representative present.

Barb Hayek made a motion to approve the membership transfer of Robert and Eleanor Fratzke from Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church La Porte City to American Lutheran Church Jesup. Second by Sue Hoey. Motion carried.

Chris Waring and Amanda Philips will be the delegates for the Synod Assembly June 9 and 10.

The Audit Committee members Connie Jones, Kaye Jones, and Mary Adams performed an audit of the 2022 tax year on April 2, 2023. They found the books and records of ALC to be materially accurate in most respects. Although controls over financial operations appear to be adequate, additional points needed attention. These have all been addressed by Treasurer Cindy Gosse.

Sheila Collins made a motion to transfer \$20,000 from the General Savings and Emergency Fund to a six-month CD at BankIowa paying a rate of 4.72%, transfer \$10,000 to a money market account at

BankIowa, and leave the remainder (currently \$13,975.95) in the fund. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried.

Ministerial Report – The Jesup Ministerial Association will be spearheading the Summer Food Program again this summer. ALC and ZLC are scheduled to assist with distribution on June 14 and August 9. A sign-up sheet for volunteers will be posted. ALC has been asked to provide boxes of instant oatmeal. Monetary donations will be collected by noisy offering during May, June, and July to assist this ministry.

Lawn Care – Cindy Gosse made a motion to hire Evan Sebetka to mow the church lawn for \$25.00 per mowing and the parsonage for \$30.00 per mowing. Second by Sheila Collins. Motion carried. He will be paid monthly.

Property Insurance – Bids for property insurance will be sought before renewal with Grinnell Mutual Insurance Co.

#### **Old Business**

Confirmation – When it's been established that assignments have been completed, council will approve the three confirmands and a date for confirmation can be set with the families. We need to find out if the current instructor, Candy Lompe from ZLC, is willing to teach again next year.

Secretary Position – The council has decided to update and expand the job description and hours of the secretarial position to better meet our needs. When this task is completed, the job will be posted for applicants.

Pulpit Supply is filled to August 20, 2023.

#### American Lutheran Church June Council Meeting June 12, 2023

President Christy Phillips called the meeting to order at 6:39 pm. Present were Christy Phillips, Sue Hoey, Shirley Bergman, and Sheila Collins. Joining by speaker phone was Mitchell Hayek. Absent were Cindy Gosse, Barb Hayek, and Beth Stanek.

Christy Phillips led devotions.

Sue Hoey made a motion to approve the agenda. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion Carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The checking account balance at the end of May was \$12,402.11. The amount of \$20,000 from the General Savings and Emergency Fund was put into a time certificate of deposit at

BankIowa for six months with an annual percentage yield of 4.78%. The General Savings and Emergency Fund was transferred from a regular savings account to a Money Market account which has a higher yield as long as the balance stays above \$10,000. Sue Hoey made a motion to remove past council president Maureen Even's name from all BankIowa accounts and add Treasurer Cindy Gosse and Financial Secretary Mike Waring to all accounts. Second by Sheila Collins. Motion carried. Shirley Bergman made a motion to transfer \$2,402.11 from the checking account to the General Savings and Emergency Money Market Fund. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried. Mitchell Hayek made a motion to approve the donation of \$250.00 that was sent with the Synod

Assembly delegates. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried. Sheila Collins made a motion to approve the Treasurer's Report. Second by Mitchell Hayek. Motion carried.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> – Mitchell Hayek made a motion to approve the Secretary's Report with two corrections. Second by Shirley Bergman. Motion carried.
