

Pickleball and Artificial Turf Ballfield Project Update

The District is completing and will soon release a Request for Proposals for the construction of 4-pickleball courts and an artificial turf ballfield within Casey Jones Park. The project builds off of the Casey Jones Park master plan which included the relocation and improvement of the park access / roadway from County Road 17 as well as the addition of the artificial turf ballfield. The addition of the 4-pickleball courts, while not initially identified in the master plan, was the result of a request from residents to develop a pickleball facility in Elizabeth. The project will also include a shared parking lot for the two new amenities which will be located just south of the LDS Church, where the temporary dog park is currently located. Per the Casey Jones Park master plan, District staff are in the process of enlarging and relocating the dog park to an area just east of the LDS Church, and west of the ballfields. This project is proudly being funded through the District's existing budget and financial resources as we continue to serve residents within our current means. We really look forward to opening these new community amenities as soon as we can and continuing to make the Elizabeth Community an even greater place to live.

2023 in Review - Building Upon Our Foundation -

Although the year sure has flown by as we enter December, it is always important to take a moment and reflect upon the past year's challenges and successes. As the year began, we sadly learned of the passing of Janet Turbett, our recently retired Office Attendant. The Board moved to honor her service to the community by dedicating a flower garden near the park office as "Janet's Garden" and an engraved stone was installed in her memory.

The year certainly improved from there however as the District began working with residents to plan for a new pickleball complex and selected a contractor to complete the campground renovation project, which wrapped up in September. The completed project has significantly improved the campground which serves an an important revenue generator for the District.

The District also partnerd with a group of volunteers to bring the ballfield at Cimarron Park back to life. Through the efforts of these volunteers who rebuilt the field, the park has now experienced a slight resurgence as youth utilized the field for practice activities throughout the Spring and early Summer. The activation of the ballfield, along with severe flooding, has led to other small park improvements as well and we look forward to even more improvements on the site in the future.

Within the area of programming and special events, the District saw increased registrations above the previous year in most programs and introduced new pickleball programming, which we hope to expand as new courts are constructed in 2024.

Lastly, long-time Board Member JC Cook decided to hang it up this past year, and we are so grateful for all his contributions and service to the community over his tenure.
