Translpanting the Pines

The District is once again providing residents the opportunity to purchase Ponderosa Pine trees that can be relocated from Casey Jones Park to your property. The trees are generally 3-25 feet tall and are in areas of the park that will see future development. Our hope is to relocate the trees within the Elizabeth Community now rather than cut them down in the future once planned park projects are initiated. District residents can purchase trees under 8 foot for \$150 and trees over 8 foot for \$250, which is a remarkable savings over tree nursery prices. There is a 10 - tree limit at this time. Residents must also arrange for and pay any associated costs for moving the trees. The District can provide contact information for tree contractors if needed. This program is intended to keep the trees within the Elizabeth Community and to assist in expanding our tree canopy. Trees will require irrigation for up to the first three years after planting in your yard, and potentially longer based on precipitation levels and draught conditions. Volunteer Group Rebuilds Ballfields at Cimarron

The Board was approached by local residents Taton Taylor and Zach Wilson in late March with a request to be allowed to rebuild the ballfields at Cimarron Park. The fields, which have not been formally used since at least 2014 and were allowed to revert to natural vegetation, had supported youth baseball for decades prior to 2010. Both Taton and Zach shared fond memories with the Board of their own glory days on that field and their desire to now coach their children in the same location. Whereas the District is challenged with limited financial resources and providing enough athletic fields to meet community needs, the Board eagerly accepted their generous offer and committed to approve and support the effort. The volunteer group, which also includes Brandon Gaither with Brandon's Dirt Works and Todd Eylar and others from the Elbert County Wranglers, has just completed spreading infield material on the first field and will begin using it for practices in coming days. The second field has been skinned of vegetation and graded, and infield material will be added in the future. In addition to rebuilding the ballfields, the project will include new park signage, grading of the parking area, improved barriers to keep vehicles from driving in the park, an improved porta-pottie set up, and renovation of the existing storage shed on the site. Although the site does not currently have a water source for the irrigation of outfields or plumbed restrooms, the District will assess the opportunity to install a well on the property in the future. The new fields will be primarily used for practices for t-ball and coach pitch teams, which do not require much of a grass outfield, and may even host some games if the need should arise. The District asks you to join us in expressing our sincere gratitude to Taton and Zach and all other volunteers that are freely giving their time and financial resources to make this project a reality. Its folks like this that really help make Elizabeth such a great community.
