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Park Project Updates

The District has been busy facilitating and planning a number of park projects this Spring and looks forward to increasing visitation and activity levels as Summer approaches. The construction of the new pickleball courts and artificial turf ballfield is moving along well, and the contractor has reported that things are on schedule at this time. We have also recently completed some great improvements near the disc-golf course first tee, including a renovation of the pathway down to the pond. A trail connection was also added to the main parking lot. Though some parking was eliminated in Evans Park as a result, we intend for parking to soon be available near the pickleball courts in Casey Jones Park to relieve some pressure from the Evans Park parking lot, particularly on Saturdays. We will be sealing and painting the Evans Park parking lot in May to define parking spots and direct traffic flow. Please note that traffic will soon flow one way through the parking area as parking spots will be diagonal. This new layout should improve safety, better accommodate larger vehicles, and decrease lot congestion.

Recognizing Our Volunteers

We encourage the community to send a big thanks to local resident Doug Foster for constructing and installing new bluebird houses within Evans Park. These habitats are well designed and built and are already attracting these beautiful

birds to Evans Park. They were installed along Running Creek and offer viewing opportunities from the town trail coming into the park. Please enjoy the viewing, but respect these new additions to the park and keep your distance to help the birds enjoy their new homes. A Few Thoughts on Park Etiquette

As the temperatures increase, the days get longer, and more people spend more time in the parks, we thought it worthwhile to mention a few thoughts for you to consider. The parks are common public spaces, and in order to ensure everyone has the opportunity for a safe enjoyable visit, we all need to adhere to some basic rules and show respect for others. In regards to dogs, keep 'em leashed and pick up their waste. Along similar lines, be sure not to litter, and maybe even pick up a piece of trash that someone else left behind. Remember that park sidewalks and trails are for non-motorized vehicles only (accessibility devices are of course fine). If you do not have to pedal, push, or scoot the device on your own, keep it in the parking lots and on designated park roadways. Keep all wheeled devices off the splashpad, it's just not safe. Remind children, and maybe some adults, to respect trees and avoid breaking off branches or damaging tree bark. Keep cars on designated park roadways and in designated parking areas. Just because it is not manicured turf does not mean it is OK to drive on, particularly within Casey Jones Park. Lastly, please be kind and show others the respect that you hope to receive. By respecting and following these few requests, we'll all have a great summer.
