Hopefully last year you were all able to enjoy the lovely Christmas lights on Fiskerton village green, all thanks to the great effort of "Friends of the Green" (FOG), with the Parish Council making it possible to purchase lights and extend the supply of electricity to the allowing us to expand the lights further around the green.

If you have any spare Christmas decorations, please feel free to put some on our tree in the green, a small Christmas Tree which was planted around 10 years ago by residents.

The village Green lights will be turned on Saturday 2nd December at 4:30 and we would love you all to come down and join us before enjoying the annual tractor run. "

One wet October morning (last year) a few hardy souls meet on the Village Green (VG), at the invitation of the Chairman, to air their views as to priorities and use of the VG. A small group of residents subsequently formed the Friends of the Green (FOG) and the preparation of the VG structured Maintenance Plan (MP) together with arrangements for a Village music event on Coronation Day soon followed. The initial priority was the removal of the damaged tree located on the corner of Main Street/Station Road. A replacement has yet to be planted.

The MP was prepared with input from the current Contactor and submitted to the Parish Council in April and subsequently agreed at the July PC meeting. The general Green appearance has improved considerably – the grass is now cut regularly accompanied by trimming around the various seats and tables.

Several additional elements are planned – cut back of the hedge adjacent to houses overlooking the Green, trimming of the numerous trees in the grassed area, clearing of the trails in the two spinneys adjacent to Station Road and repair of the fence/ trimming of the hedgerow adjacent to Main Street.

Clarification has also been obtained as to the balance of funds available to the PC for use in maintaining the VG both in the short and long term.

It was planned for a few residents to refurbish the various seats and tables in early October, but the weather intervened and probably best now left for when conditions are drier.

The Christmas Lights beckon on December 2 and the next music event is in the planning stage.


LAMP POST POPPIES FOR REMEMBRANCE DAY

For several years now the Parish Council has displayed Royal British Legion lamp post poppies around the parish during November as a way of honouring those from our parish who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Last year it was decided that we would try to find out as much as we could about the thirteen local men who died in the two world wars and that we would write their name, year of death and their regiment on the poppies.



We have also tried, as far as possible, to place the named poppies near each man's home or somewhere associated with them.



For example, Private Frank Foster was born at Brinkley in 1896 but by the 1911 census his family had moved to Morton Fields where his father, George, was a market gardener. Frank joined the South Notts Hussars in July 1912 and was mobilised on the outbreak of war in 1914. He served in Egypt and then Gallipoli where he was reported as missing, presumed killed in action, on 22nd August 1915. He is commemorated on the Helles Memorial, Turkey.

His poppy is on Wilson's Lane, at the junction with Gravelly Lane, near Morton Fields Cottage.

ST DENIS, MORTON

As many of you will be aware, Rev Phil retired last May after – as he was fond of saying -'seven years, seven months and seven days' as our vicar. As a result, St Denis, Morton and the other churches in our Benefice are now in what the Church of England rather grandly calls an 'inter-regnum', a time for reflection before a new vicar is appointed.

Inevitably, this has meant a reduction in the number of regular services but, with the support of visiting clergy and our Readers, we do hold an in-person service at 10.30am on the fourth Sunday each month. In addition, there is a well-attended on-line service via Zoom at 9.00am every Sunday which lasts for around half-an-hour. Whilst there will not be a service on Christmas Day this year, our ever-popular Carol Service at St Denis will take place at 6.00pm on Sunday, 17th December, after which mulled wine and mince pies will be served in the Church Hall. We do hope that you will come along – and that you will be in good voice!!

Finally, do make a note in your 2024 diary: our Plough Sunday service will be at 10.30am on Sunday, 7th January. This is a very special service when a plough is carried into church to be blessed at the start of the farming year. Once again, we will be joined by members of Sullivan's Sword who will regale us with plough songs and sword dancing. Again, refreshments will be served.

So, as we come again to celebrate the birth of Jesus, the world faces profound challenges,

not least from the impact of climate change and from the ravages of conflict in Ukraine, in the Middle East and elsewhere. There are deep divisions within our own country too. Injustice, hunger, persecution and abuse are the daily experience of too many. But the message of Christmas is one of truth, of love and of justice. So let us embrace that message and ask what we can do to make the world, our country, our community a better place. Individually, it may not be much but together we really can make a difference.

Flood Group

Storm Babet was a complex weather system which brought heavy and persistent rainfall across the country.

Data from rainfall gauges across Nottinghamshire show an average of 60mm falling across the county in 24 hours. The figures from this intense rainfall event are equivalent to approximately a 1 in 20-year event over the county.

River levels during Storm Babet were exceptionally high, with some peaking at levels never previously recorded. The river Trent experienced a significant peak following Storm Babet, which impacted many nearby communities



and low-lying land. Peak levels on the Trent were comparable to the flooding event during 2020.

Fiskerton-cum-Morton on this occasion got of lightly with only a small number of properties affected by the floods from the inland waters not the river.

As a result of this event your Flood Warden Councillor Diana Powell, has teamed up with the local villages, the Flood Resilience Agency and Notts Council to work together to ensure we are all well prepared for any future events. We will be looking for volunteers in the new year, more details will be published on that in the New Year.

We need you!



As we enter the Winter months, the possibility of snowfall increases, and with it the impacts of snow melt on flood risk. Some of the UK's largest floods have been attributed to snow melt.

Snow melt forecasting models are run across the country which help us to predict the impacts on flooding and flood risk.

To support this system, we need to expand our number of snow observations with help from the general public. Taking a snow observation is a quick and easy task, involving only walking a few steps outside your front door, for each morning there is snow on the ground. All that is required, is to take some snow depth measurements using a ruler and input this information onto the Met Office Weather Observations Website <u>Met Office WOW - Home Page</u>

Our thanks go to great efforts of our team of volunteers for all their work in putting the Fair together, the stall holders for attending, Woodrow Teas for refreshments and all those who came along to support us, and to Anila Boney for giving us the opportunity in taking on the Fair to raise much-needed funds. We raised just under £800, a great result!!! We plan the same again next year and will, hopefully, see more villagers attending.

POP UP TEA ROOM. We were approached by Amy Wilkinson, from Woodrow Tea, with her idea of Pop-Up Tea Rooms in village halls. She was familiar with the hall, as her husband is Ian, used to live in Fiskerton. We were happy to support her initiative and provide something different. She even had a message from one of Arthur Radford's grandsons saying how delighted his grandfather would be with the use of the hall!! Dates were booked for 2 tea rooms and a special pre-Christmas event with afternoon tea, cocktails, prosecco and live music. Unfortunately, due to a lack of support within the villages for the first Pop Up Tea Room, it has been decided to cancel the second Pop Up Tea Room and the Christmas event. Amy assures us, she would like to try again next year, and we will welcome her back.


