They all jump from stone column to stone column until Square tumbles off into the bushes, reappearing with a big bushy beard made of moss. They all laugh. Cut to:

The shapes sit on some rocks in a nearby clearing. Circle pulls out her lunch pack and hands out peanut butter and jam sandwiches. Square tucks into his and looks around contentedly.
