

# WEEK 5: Laws for Worship, Ministry, and Time

### THE SETTING

- Chs. 1-11 dealt with God's commands
- Chs. 12-26 deal with the Law Code
- Similar to the U. S. Constitution vs. U. S. Law
- Chs. 12-16 deal with worship, ministry, and time

## CHAPTER 12-WORSHIP

- Bottom line: worship in a new way in a new place.
- Destroy all previous places of worship (vv. 1-4).
- Seek the place God will chose (v. 5).
- "You shall rejoice" (v. 7, repeated in vv. 12 & 18).
- Worship becomes more permanent and proper once in Promised Land (vv. 8-14)
- Eat meat anywhere, but not tithes and not blood "for the blood is the life" (vv. 15-28). Do not neglect the Levite. Tithes go to the right place.
- Don't worship like they did (e.g., child sacrifice) (vv. 29-32).

# CHAPTER 13—PUNISHMENTS FOR IDOLATRY (3 examples)

- 1. If a prophet leads you astray, kill the prophet (vv. 1-5).
- 2. If a loved one leads you astray, kill the loved one (vv. 6-11); "Your hand shall be first."
- 3. If a city has been led astray, destroy the city (vv. 12-18).
- Idolatry is like a cancer that sometimes needs chemo to kill it.

#### CHAPTER 14-FOOD & TITHES

- "You are sons/children of the Lord" and "a people holy to the Lord." (vv. 1-2)
- Holiness involves boundaries and blessings.

- Clean and unclean animals, based on hygiene and contrast with other cultures (vv. 3-21). Also, don't mix life and death (v. 21).
- Tithe food and produce "so that you learn to fear the Lord." (v. 23). If you can't carry the items, sell them and take money instead. Do not neglect the Levite. Tithes go to the right place.
- Every 3 years the tithes goes directly to the least (vv. 28-29).

## CHAPTER 15-SABBATICAL YEAR

- Bottom line: family is more important than free market.
- Debts are released ("let fall") every 7 years. "There will be no poor among you." (vv. 1-6).
- If a "brother" becomes poor, lend generously even in the 7<sup>th</sup> year (vv. 7-11). "For there will never cease to be poor in the land."
- Release slaves/servants unless they want to stay (vv. 12-18).
- Firstborn set aside for tithes, not for work (vv. 19-23).

## CHAPTER 16—HOLI-DAYS: PASSOVER, SHAVUOT, SUKKOT

- Bottom line: remember God's deliverance from Egypt to Promised Land.
- Passover (vv. 1-8)
  - o Rehearse certain features of the first Passover
    - Unleavened bread = haste
    - Celebrate in the evening = match timing
- Feast of Weeks (Shavuot)
  - o Seven weeks (or 50 days) after harvest/Passover.
  - o Freewill offering as each is able.
  - o "Remember that you were a slave in Egypt."
- Feast of Booths (Sukkot)
  - A feast to celebrate "the work of your hands."
  - o Booths were reminiscent of Israel's wilderness wanderings.
- "Justice, and only justice, you shall follow" (v. 20).
