You do not have to read far to realize two facts: I am not a writer and I am a Plumeria fanatic. On June 13, 1998, I attended the Plumeria Plant Sale in Houston at Hermann Park. We got there early because we learned from attending last year's sale that the area is packed with people after the first hour. I did not think there were as many plants for sale this year. I restrained myself and only bought a few. I did see several of the people who had come to Corpus Christi for our sale. Actually, they twisted my arm or I probably wouldn't have bought so many.

The highlight of the sale was a showing of a Plumeria collection from several countries. They were in bloom and beautiful. The owner said he wanted people to realize that Plumerias are grown all over the world.

One of my purchases (called Plumeria Pudica) was from Caracas, Venezuela and he had a big one in bloom. It is also called "Bridal Bouquet". I saw it on Jim Little's list, also at Tea's Nursery. Another of my purchases was from Martinique called "Wild One". Both plants are unique in their growth patterns and their foliage.

After the sale I just had to go by Tea's Nursery and found in the rooting barn a species, Stenophyllus, which I had seen on the Connoisseur's List.

On July 11, 1998, I went to the Plumeria Sale in Seabrook at Clear Lake Park. They had more plants (names) at this sale. I managed to find a few I couldn't live without. They also had for sale ginger, lilies, and oleanders. Then again I visited Tea's and found "Brancher", which was also on the Connoisseur's List.

If you are ever in Houston at the plant sale time – Go!. It is quite an experience. My husband is glad it happens only once a year!
