Some of the topics he spoke on were, How to Avoid Stem Rot on Plumerias and Rust Fungus. I am presently trying a sample of the Phyton 27 on my Plumerias for rust and will give you the results at the next meeting. There were 22 Members at our March meeting. Leatrice Koch won a large fiberglass pot and Vivian Sheffey won the garden tiller as door prizes.
