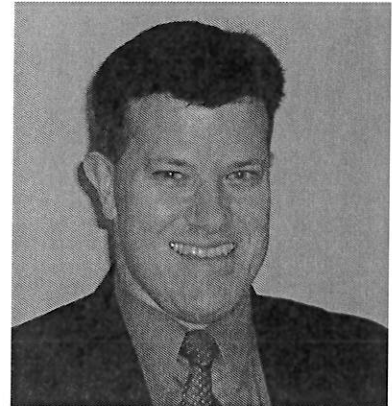
Association Objectives

The objectives of the Association shall be to render services to and act on behalf of component societies in the following ways:

- a. to assist in arranging low cost housing finance to low income home buyers,
- b. to procure the passing of such legislation or the adoption of such administrative action in matters affecting its component societies as may from time to time be called for;
- c. to compile statistical, accounting, actuarial, legal, financial, architectural and other data for the information of its component societies;
- d. to investigate and report upon any matter affecting the operation of Co-operative Housing Societies;
- e. to issue or to arrange for the issue periodically of a publication devoted primarily to matters of interest to component societies or their members and to distribute same amongst its component societies and their members;
- f. to procure legal advice and to take legal action in any matter affecting component societies or their members in their relationship with such component societies;
- g. if required by a component society, to supervise its operations and to arrange for the audit of its accounts;
- h. to join with the Australian Council of Housing Societies and with any other body having similar objects to the said Council for the purpose of sponsoring, promoting and encouraging co-operative housing for the people of Australia;
- i. to acquire shares in any company or other bodies specified in Section 36(1) of the Act which has undertaken to render special services to the Association in consideration of such acquisition;
- j. to render such other services to its component societies as the Board may determine from time to time;
- k. to ensure that members maintain a professional standard of conduct in accordance with the Association by-laws.

President's Report

I'm pleased to provide this report as President of the Co-operative Housing Societies Association of NSW. There have been no significant changes since my last report.



The primary operation of our member Societies continues to be meeting the obligations of servicing mortgage loans advanced to their members. Most of our Society members are part of wider businesses that also provide mortgage broking services for other lenders. This assists in keeping up to date with changes in the overall mortgage industry.

Co-operative Housing Society home purchase assistance

Earlier this year, the NSW Premier declared commitment to the affordability challenge facing aspiring home-owners. This Association wrote to the Premier noting our proud history supporting this goal, and sought to assist in achieving improvement. We subsequently met with the Minister and others to discuss the opportunities a renewed Co-operative Housing Society program could achieve. Previous programs had a proven track record of assisting those in the margins to achieve home-ownership. However, they needed updating for today's lending environment. We also raised other programs that could assist.

Since the mid 1930's Co-operative Housing Societies have assisted tens of thousands of low to middle income earners achieve home ownership. Whilst some Society lending continues today, there is an ongoing shortage of suitable funding arrangements for those in the margins. Previously, many families who were deemed unsuitable by mainstream lenders, achieved home ownership due to proven Co-operative Housing Society lending programs. Without government support in renewing these programs, many more families now remain on public housing waiting lists.

Regretfully, following consideration of our detailed submissions, the Minister wrote in September this year to advise that government was unable to give further consideration at this time.

Membership benefit

This Association continues to be the peak body of Co-operative Housing Societies in NSW, and pursues the interests of our member Societies. It also assists members by obtaining third party services at a reduced cost by aggregation through this Association. These have included ongoing software maintenance, development of credit reporting services, and legal advice on legislative changes from time to time.

Audit Waiver

The rising audit cost has been monitored by the Board, and in view of the rationalised operations the Association the cost had become inappropriate. Following deliberations, and discussions with the Auditors, the Board sought an exemption from Audit. The Registry of Co-operatives & Associations has granted a requested exemption, for a period of three (3) years, under S149 (1) of the Act. This is to operate until 2019 at which time the matter is to be reviewed. This change represents a saving to this Association of over \$5,500per annum.

Vale - Ian Kirkwall Downing

I sadly report the passing of our Life Member Ian Downing, 17 October 2017. Ian fought serious illness and succeeded in remissions over a number of years before his recent passing.

Ian was the Secretary/Manager of the Metropolitan Group of Societies since the early 1980's. Ian also gave his time to benefit the CHS movement, and served on the CHS Standards & Advisory Committees for many years. Ian was also a Director of this Association, President (1996-2001), and Honorary Secretary (2003-2014). In recognition of his dignified and long term dedication to the Co-operative Housing Societies Association of NSW and its members, Ian was admitted as an Association Life Member in 2016.

The kind and friendly manner in which Ian contributed will be greatly missed.

Vale – Anthony (Tony) Eric Rumsey

I also note the sad passing of Tony Rumsey, 9 October 2017. Whilst Tony had health issues, his passing was rather sudden and unexpected. Tony was a director of the Parramatta Group of Societies since 1970, and Chairman since 1995. Tony was a strong supporter of the co-operative housing society movement, and a regular delegate at the Association AGM's & Conferences. His personable approach and sense of humour will be sadly missed.

Vale - Robert (Bob) Ward

Sadly, I also report the passing of Bob Ward, 1 September 2017, following an illness diagnosed early in 2017. Bob was nominated as a Director of this Association by the Central Coast Group of Co-operative Housing Societies. He also served as President from 1989 to 1991. Bob was active in the Central Coast community and Council for many years. We acknowledge his considerable contributions to the movement over many years. He will be sadly missed.

Board & Management

I again thank all our Directors who give their time to serve on the Board.

Particular thanks goes to Colin Harmer, who has continued to actively assist despite retiring from his direct CHS business interests many years ago. I also thank Bruce Terry who continues to attend to daily management of the Association.

Without the Directors the Association would not operate, and they play important roles in pursuing the interests of the Association and the Co-operative Housing Society membership.

Wallace G Pooley & Keith E Downing Memorial Trust Fund Award

The Wallace G. Pooley & Keith E. Downing Memorial Trust Fund Award commemorates the exceptional services provided over a period of 43 years by Wallace Pooley and Keith Downing in their capacity as honorary general secretaries to the Co-operative Housing Societies Association of New South Wales.

Wallace George Pooley was a dedicated man, virtually devoting his life to the advancement of the Terminating & Building Society Movement, as it was known before the change to Housing Societies. The strength of the Movement today is largely due to the remarkable drive he gave to this industry in its formative years. From the Association's inception in 1937 he acted as its honorary secretary until his death in 1954.

He was an extraordinarily able organiser with a background of newspaper reporting. He was the chief executive responsible for helping the government to set up Co-operative Building Societies with government guarantees under the Co-operation Act of 1923.

Wallace Pooley also formed the largest group of Building Societies in New South Wales and acted as its secretary until his death at a relatively early age. His premature death was a great loss and one of his dearest wishes was the stabilisation of the building industry and the encouragement of young people into it.

Keith Edward Downing, a chartered accountant, was a thoughtful and steady man with great enthusiasm for the building society movement. In 1954 he was appointed honorary general secretary and held the position until his death in 1980. He also had been actively involved with Terminating Building Societies since their inception in 1937 in New South Wales from which time he was also the founding secretary of the Metropolitan Homes Group of Co-operative Housing Societies.

In 1956 he was one of the chief architects in making the services of Co-operative Building Societies available to government under the Commonwealth-State Housing Agreement. Over the years that followed, this arrangement enabled the provision of a major flow of home purchase funds to the co-operative movement greatly assisting low and moderate income earners purchase homes throughout Australia.

Keith Downing was one of the co-founders of the Australian Council of Co-operative Housing Societies, the national peak body, and served as its honorary secretary for many years. Also, for a number of years, he was vice president of The International Union of Building Societies and Savings Associations, ultimately being awarded honorary life membership of the International Union.

His wise counsel to the Industry and the desire to facilitate affordable housing finance was well recognized by those who knew him.

Following their deaths funds, were donated by member societies of the Association and those who had worked with them which enabled the creation of a Memorial Trust. In accordance with the terms of the deed the Board of the Co-operative Housing Societies Association of New South Wales decided that the most appropriate way to perpetuate the memory of such visionary and active personalities was to create an award recognising those young Australians who are furthering their knowledge with the object of continuing the visions started by Wallace Pooley and Keith Downing.

2017 Recipients

Jai Sampson – Apprentice Carpenter
Central Coast Group Training - Host Employer - Central Coast Council

Jai feels the skills that he has gained through his training will be with him for life. When he does purchase his own home, he is excited at the prospect of doing all of his own renovations using the techniques he has perfected over time through his trade.

Being a part of the building industry for the past few years, Jai has identified certain 'trends' that he believes will continue. Firstly the rapid expansion of the housing industry, particularly on the Central Coast, with new and planned estates being discussed all the time. As a result, there will be plenty of opportunities for young people not unlike himself, to develop their careers too. Carpenters will always have a steady supply of work. 2016, Jai finished his Certificate III in Carpentry through the Hunter Institute of TAFE, Ourimbah Campus and completed his trade qualification on the 30th June 2017. Earlier this month, Jai was awarded Apprentice of the Year at the NSW State Training Awards – Central Coast Region and will go on to compete at State Level later this year.

Jai's long term goal is to start his own carpentry business; initially starting on the tools himself with the aim of training his own apprentices during his career too.

Jai has been really career focused over the past few years and has been investigating extra business courses and contemplating studying a Diploma of Building to gain his Builders' Licence. He plans to apply for his Contractor's Licence soon to enable him to subcontract to other builders now that he has completed his trade.

Jai would like to work on the tools for as long as he can and has plans to become a TAFE Teacher or a School Woodwork Teacher so that he can pass on his knowledge to other people that are keen to learn.

1 Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

2 Non Current Receivables

Non Current receivables includes an unsecured loan of \$410,775 to Association Mutual Services Ltd which at 30 June 2017 had accumulated losses amounting to \$104,373. The recovery of this loan is dependent upon the ability of Association Mutual Services Ltd to generate surpluses in future years sufficient to cover the accumulated losses.
