Learning Activities:	Lesson Activities: Class discussion: Start the first day with a question From our listening today while completing the worksheets, what is violin music? What do you perceive (understand) of violin music? Turn and talk With your group, write a quick 3 sentence answer to the question to share with the entire class. What answers are the same or similar to others in the class? Look at pictures while listening to violin music display pictures while the music is playing. Students take notes while listening, answering these questions 1. Where do you think you may hear violin music like our 1st musical example? Which group is playing the music? Why did you choose that group? Etc. Listening selections: 1. Eine Kleine Nacht Musik- Mozart https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=f3u5-MkFY5E Which string quartet is playing Mozart's piece translated to A Little Night Music? Why did you choose the group you chose? What does that say about our perception of orchestral strings music? TEACHER-Talk about the word stereotype with the class.
