You wish the older ones would have some of the drive and positivism of youth to avoid sitting on the sidelines retiring from ministry. Life has an expiration date. There are only so many grains of sand in our hourglass. They descend. They pass. And then they are gone. How were they invested? Often too late is this even considered.

Let us make the most of every day. Let us use our time to invest in people. Let us make the Lord preeminent in everything we do. Let us make ministry a priority. And let us finish well. Not a flash in the pan. Not a sprint. But a marathon. Persevering in the face of opposition and weariness. Let us live every day of life like it mattered for eternity. Because it does.
