Parents took to the streets to peacefully challenge SOGI123 <u>Gender Ideology</u> in the K-12 school system all across the country on September 20th. United in solidarity for parental rights!

Regardless of what you may have heard from select legacy media outlets, a <u>new survey</u> <u>suggests</u> that these Canadian parents are not part of any radical fringe group that is dislocated from current thinking or political norms. <u>They are the majority</u>.

Predictably, it was labelled "hate" and "anti-2SLGBTQIA+" by activists, institutions, labour unions, corporations and media outlets that have adopted neo-Marxist Critical Queer Theory beliefs. At this same time, it was praised by ordinary parents, religious-faith groups, and even many LGB & Trans-identified people. It reached Federal politics, with Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and Opposition Leader, Pierre Poilievre weighing in on X, formerly Twitter.

The HDSB released its own <u>September 20th Protest Statement</u>, which subtly suggests parental voices will "*harm*" individuals, instead of teaching that democracy requires open inquiry, listening to different views and engaging in good faith dialogue about complex issues.

Many individuals and organizations have issued statements to counter the mainstream narrative, like this one from the <u>Muslim Association of Canada</u>.

Students First Ontario parents believe that School Boards are failing the public when they refuse to engage the legitimate concerns of parents, who are ultimately **responsible** (as per the Family Law Act) for their children's upbringing. Most parents made it abundantly clear that while they may oppose SOGI123 Gender Ideology in schools, they respect the rights of all Canadians regardless of their sexual orientation or beliefs.
