### My Experiences in the U.S.

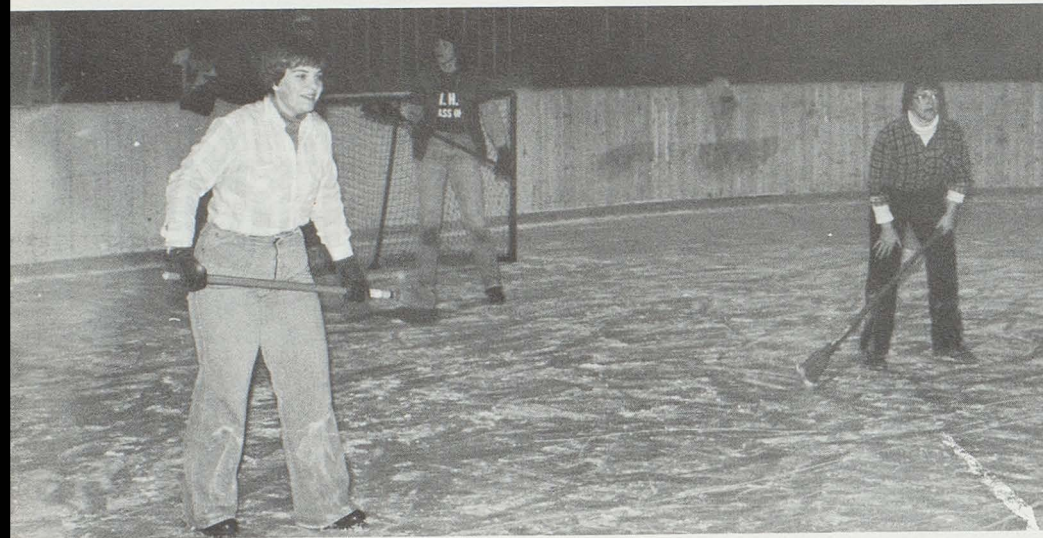
