EDITORIAL COMMENT

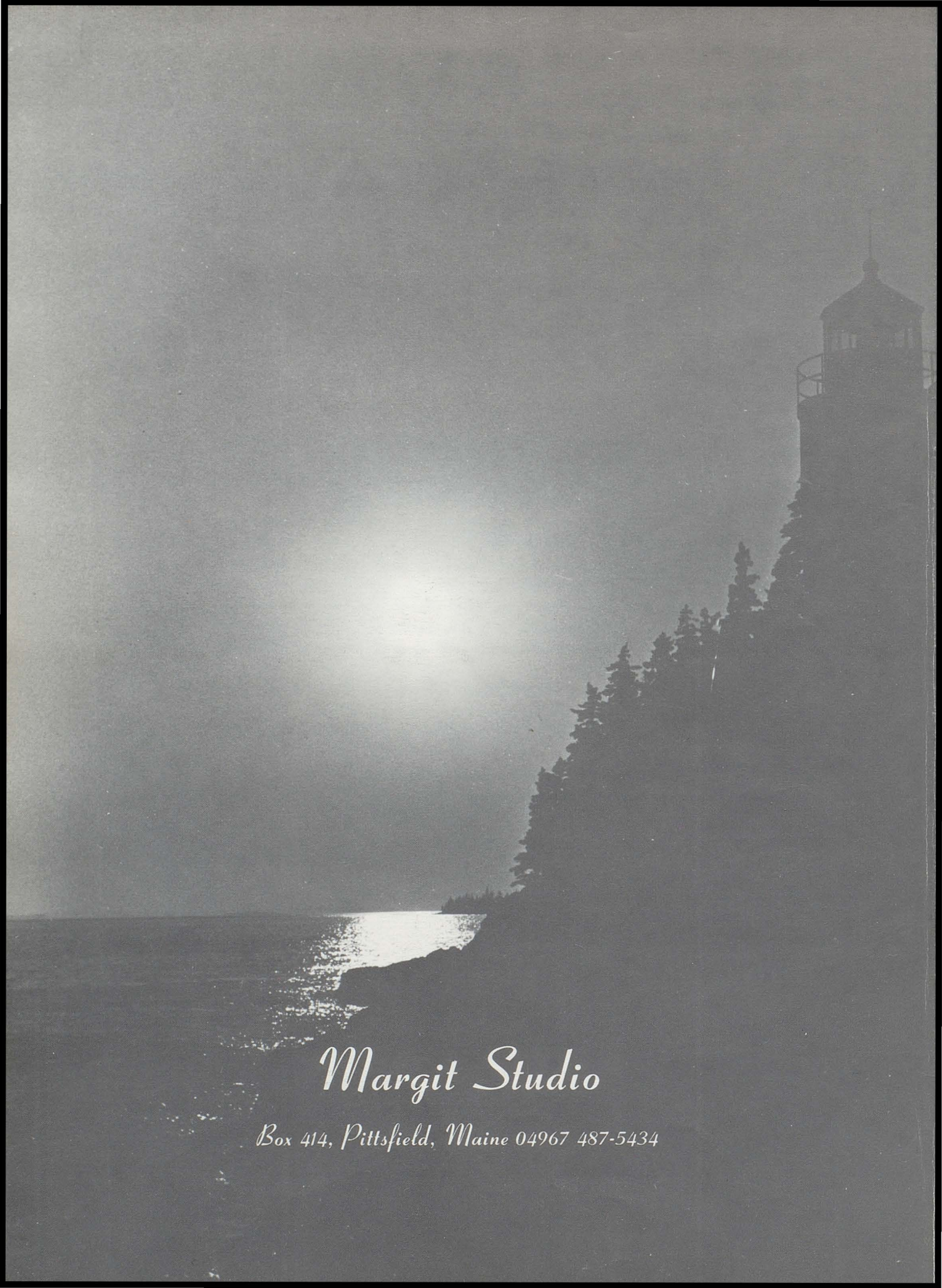

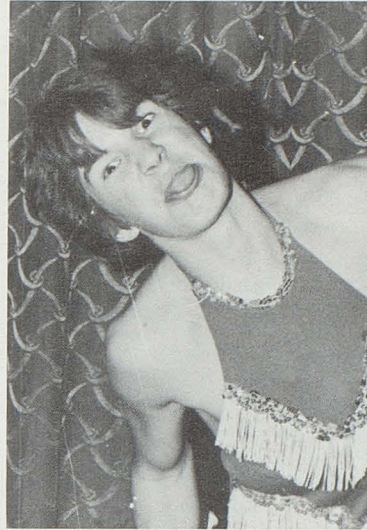
On October 24, the cafeteria was filled with laughter and fun as the seniors initiated the freshmen into the high school.

Sharon Chasse had to ride her tricycle on stage while Tina Guerrette and Kris Brailer had to "can can" in a chorus line.

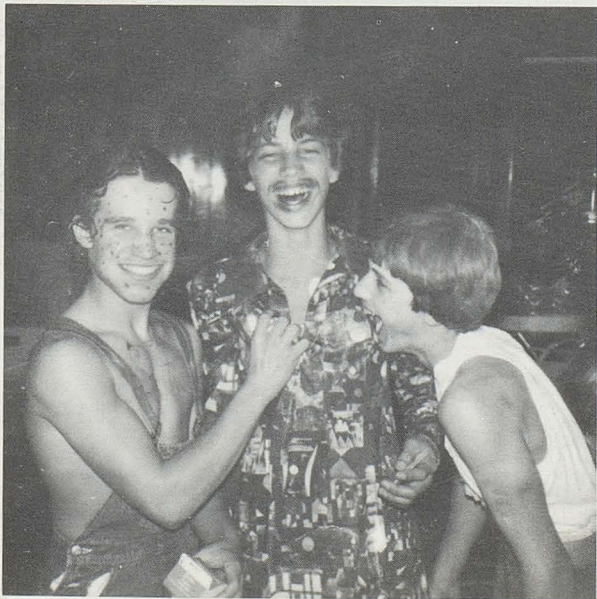

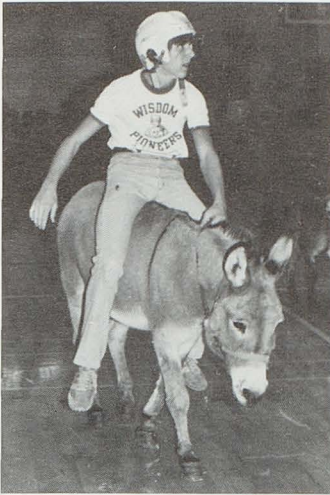

Whoever thought ten donkeys would be in the gym of Wisdom High School — never mind that — whoever thought they would have those ten donkeys play basketball?!

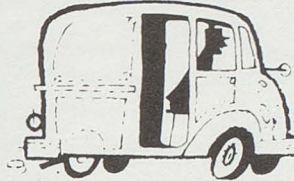
Well, that's what happened — on November, the Student Council got together and chose some teachers and students to play against each other and ride the donkeys! What a game it was!

The music was performed by our favorites — ZIG ZAG with Dave Lizotte at the helm, and our own John Nadeau (Senior) on bass.

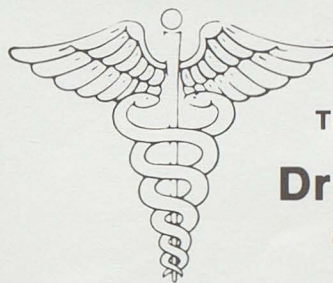
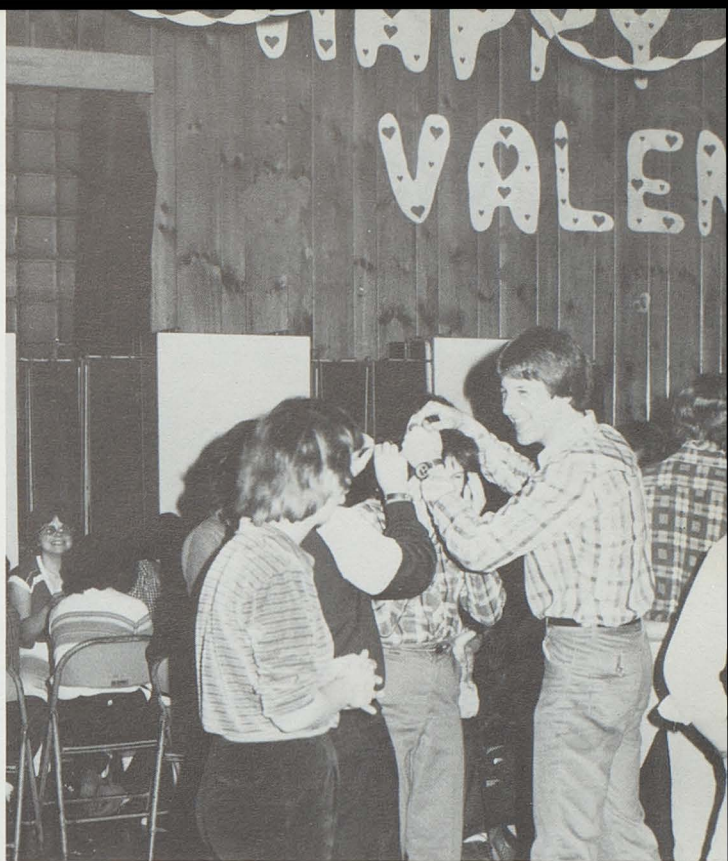
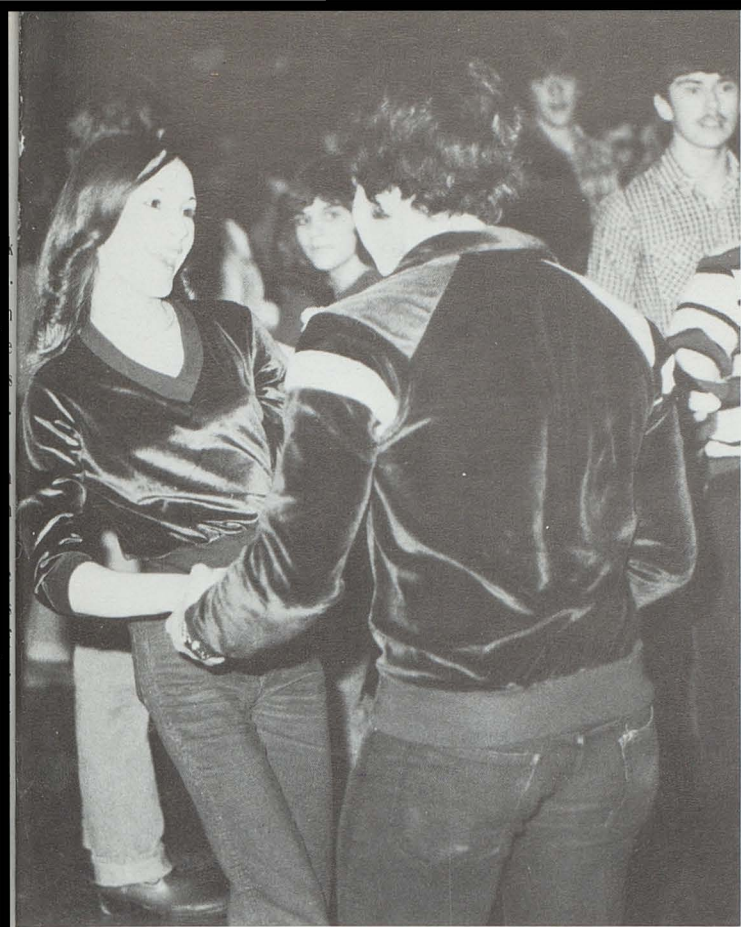
