Thanks are in order to all of you who helped to make our Bake Sale a success. Whether you aided us in supplying the food, or aided us by buying the food, we thank you.

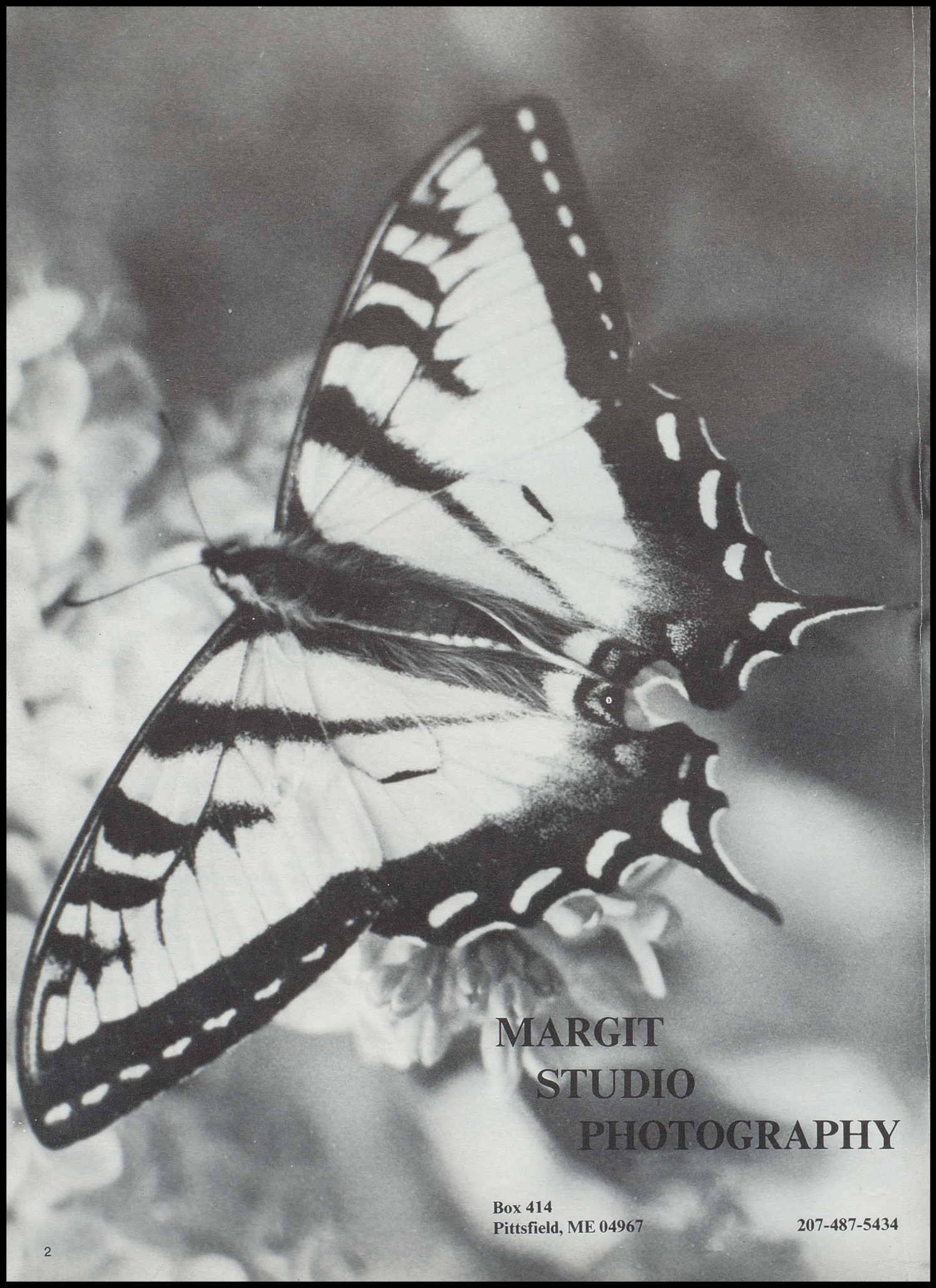
During the last couple of weeks of school, you may have seen "Summertime" T-shirts walking about. Thanks for buying these also! You're continued support is vitally necessary.

Potato-pickin' Club



Forget not this night, for it will be gone tomorrow the people, the glimmer and the lights. A time for remembering all the fun we had together the laughter, the carnival, and tonight.

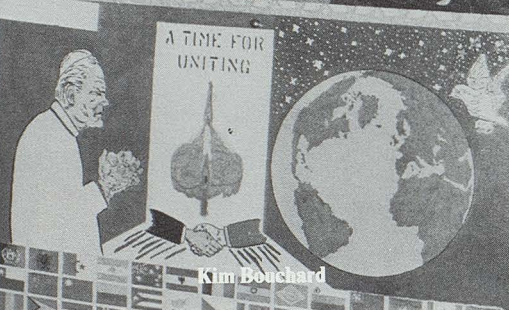

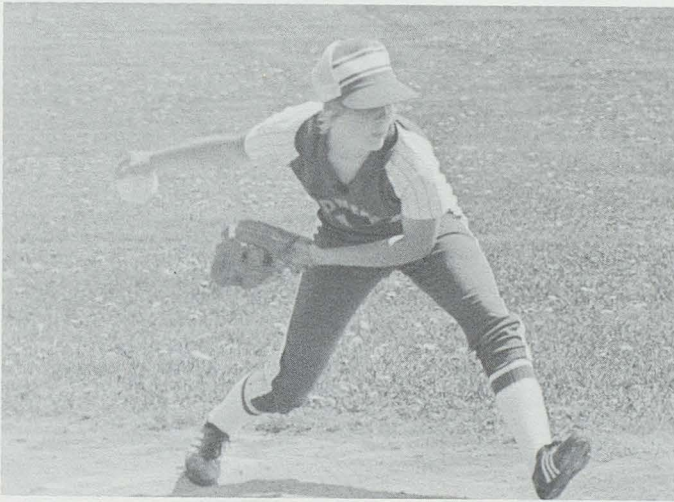
